




Faith Formation Companion to Prayers in the Pew™

→ MONTHLY SYNOPSIS ←

October 2020 – October is dedicated to the Rosary, the Church's most popular and powerful devotional prayer. It's a time for us to reassess our relationship with the Mother of Jesus, who is also our mother, the one who comes to our aid in every need. We must always remember that the Rosary is a calm, repetitive prayer that seeks to focus our hearts on the mysteries of Christ's Life, Death and Resurrection. "Whenever we say 'Mary', she says 'Jesus." (St. Louis Marie de Montfort)

THE HOLY ROSARY

The existence of the holy Rosary is both miraculous and natural. In the natural sense, the Rosary developed through a long, organic process in the life of the Church.

The tradition of praying all 150 psalms was common among monks since the time of St. Benedict in the 6th century. However, the uneducated lay brothers could not recite the psalms, so they participated in the prayer by repeating 150 Our Fathers and keeping track of them on a string of beads.

In the early Middle Ages the 150 Our Fathers were then divided into three sets of fifty by the Irish missionaries who used the prayer beads for evangelization. By the early 1200s it was customary in the Latin Church to pray Hail Mary's on the same beads. Praying on 150 beads, therefore, became a way for the laity to participate in the prayer of the monks as they recited the psalms.

Now comes the miraculous part. Blessed Alan de la Roche (1428-1475) was given a series of visions which confirmed that St. Dominic received the Rosary directly from the hands of the Blessed Virgin Mary. His visions are private revelations, which nonetheless have great authority. The Dominican Order has traditionally been the strongest proponent of this devotion.

It is more likely, however, that another religious order had a greater role in establishing the Rosary in the form we know it today. In the early 1400s, Dominic of Prussia, a Carthusian monk, began linking the 150 prayers with little phrases that reflected the lives of Jesus and Mary. This practice began the tradition of

meditating on these precious truths which were termed mysteries. This monk was also the one who used the term "rosarium" (little rose garden) to describe the practice.

The traditional Rosary includes three sets of mysteries, the Joyful, the Sorrowful and the Glorious. There are five mysteries in each set (fifteen mysteries total), which give us a full view of the Life, Death and Resurrection of Christ, the essence of everything we believe.

While the Joyful Mysteries address the early life of Jesus and the Sorrowful/Glorious Mysteries deal with the end of His life, there were no mysteries that addressed Christ's public ministry, which encompassed His saving work on earth for our salvation.

In 2002 Pope John Paul II issued the Encyclical Letter, Rosarium Virginis, in which he seemed to "add" another set of mysteries to the Rosary, the Luminous Mysteries (also called the Mysteries of Light). In this, the Holy Father simply filled in a chronological gap in the mysteries. All of these mysteries deal with His public ministry and are found in familiar passages of the Gospels.

Devotees of the Rosary may pray the traditional Rosary alone (15 mysteries) or with the Luminous Mysteries added to it. Overall, there are four sets of twenty separate mysteries which we contemplate with Our Lady whenever we recite the Rosary.

Challenge yourself this month to slow down and prayerfully focus your heart on Christ, with Mary.



CATECHISM CONNECTION



Mary gave her consent in faith at the Annunciation and maintained it without hesitation at the foot of the Cross. Ever since, her motherhood has extended to the brothers and sisters of her Son "who still jour-

ney on earth surrounded by dangers and difficulties." Jesus, the only mediator, is the way of our prayer; Mary, his mother and ours, is wholly transparent to him: she "shows the way" and is herself "the Sign" of the way, according to the traditional iconography of East and West. (CCC, 2674)

Pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death: By asking Mary to pray for us, we acknowledge ourselves to be poor sinners and we address ourselves to the "Mother of Mercy," the All-Holy One. We give ourselves over to her now, in the Today of our lives. And our trust broadens further, already at the present moment, to surrender "the hour of our death" wholly to her care. May she be there as she was at her son's death on the cross. May she welcome us as our mother at the hour of our passing to lead us to her son, Jesus, in paradise. (CCC, 2677)

Mary is the perfect Orans (pray-er), a figure of the Church. When we pray to her, we are adhering with her to the plan of the Father, who sends his Son to save all men. Like the beloved disciple we welcome Jesus' mother into our homes, for she has become the mother of all the living. We can pray with and to her. The prayer of the Church is sustained by the prayer of Mary and united with it in hope. (CCC, 2679)





The Story of the Miracle of Michael Schachle The Result of Dedicated Prayers for the Intercession of Fr. McGiveny

There little baby was to be the 13th child of Dan and Michelle Schachle. The family had developed into being devout Chatholics and Dan had become an Insurance Agent for the Knights of Columbus, being a Brother Knight for several years.

During developmental ultrasounds and monitoring it was discovered that the baby not only was showing signs of Down's Syndrome, but had also displayed a commonly fatal defect known as fetal hydrops.

Coincidentally Dan and Michelle went on a pilgrimage to The Vatican and Spain where they visited the Shrine of Our Lady of Fatima in Portugal. During this trip they asked for prayers of intercession of Fr. MiGivney from other family and friends.

Upon their return, Michelle's next visit to her doctor revealed the fetal hydrops had miraculously reversed and the baby boy - to be named Michael in honor of Fr. MiGiveny as a promise Dan made during his prayers for intercession - was to come to term and be born as the 13th child.



On May 26, 2020, Pope Francis approved a decree recognizing a miracle attributed to the intercession of Father McGivney and opening the way for his beatification. On Oct. 31, the Mass for Beatification was celebrated in the Cathedral of Saint Joseph in Hartford, Conn. An Apostolic Letter was read from Pope Francis that declared Father McGivney would now have the title of Blessed Michael McGivney. He is the third priest born in the United States to be raised to this honor, and the first priest to be beatified who spent his whole priestly ministry in a US parish.

The pope's Apostolic Letter stated that Blessed Michael McGivney's "zeal for the proclamation of the Gospel and generous concern for the needs of his brothers and sisters made him an outstanding witness of Christian solidarity and fraternal assistance."

The Cause for Canonization for Father McGivney was opened in the Archdiocese of Hartford in 1997, when he was given the title Servant of God. On March 15, 2008, his heroic virtue was recognized by Pope Benedict XVI, and Father McGivney was given the title Venerable Servant of God. This important step occurred after years of careful investigation of Father McGivney's life, spirituality and holiness by the Congregation for the Causes of Saints. The declaration of Venerable confirmed what those who knew him in life, and others who call upon him since his death, have believed about Father McGivney: He lived a life of heroic virtue with an extraordinary love of God and neighbor.



A 100 YEAR LIFE OF A BROTHER KNIGHT

Beyond the San Diego Diocese you may not recognize the name of Sir Knight **John Garrahy**- he was not a high office holder such as Chapter President, State Committee Chair, State Deputy... however we likely all a brother Knight like John in our Council and Assembly membership rosters— doing the work at the Council and Assembly. John is an example of a lifetime of community service to his fellow citizens, Catholic community and the Knights of Columbus...-Editor.



It's been nearly 100 years since **John Garrahy** was born on a farm in Fairfax, Minnesota on June 11, 1920. He is the third of nine children; three girls and six boys. In December 1941, he made his way to California to work in the defense industry but, because he was A1 for the draft, he could not be hired. Instead, he enlisted in the United States Marine Corps and worked construction jobs while preparing to ship overseas.

Before he left, he gave **Ethel Margaret Madigan** (1919-1997) a diamond ring. She was a girl he'd met back home who'd come to San Diego to work at Consolidated Aircraft. Ethel wore that ring the entire two years he was gone. In late 1944, they made their way back to Minnesota by train, balanced on suitcases, to be married on November 13 at All Saints Church in Madison Lake.

If you ask John the secret to a happy life, the soon-to-be centenarian will tell you to "smile and be lucky". If you ask those who know him, they'll tell you that a lot of hard work goes into that luck.

After leaving the Marines in 1946 with the rank of staff sergeant, John worked first for the Border Patrol and then as a firefighter on Camp

Pendleton, where he retired with the rank of Captain.

Ethel wrote in her memoirs, "When John was in the Fire Department, he worked twenty-four hours on and twenty-four hours off. His shift ended at 7:00 a.m. He would come home, eat breakfast, and then it was as if someone had waved a magic wand. Off came the fireman's uniform and on went the carpenter's overalls. For the next eight to ten hours, he was a carpenter. This was like two full time jobs, but he seemed to thrive on it."

John was also an active in Catholic fraternal organizations. He served as Grand Knight in the Knights of Columbus and was a founding member of the Ben Zuri caravan of the Order of Alhambra, a Catholic fraternal organization dedicated to the developmentally disabled. "John was always pretty handy mechanically and would make repairs at our group homes. He also built floats for the parade," remembers **Mike Caligiuri**, current Grand Commander of Ben Zuri.

A very large group of Knights of Columbus formed a Guard of Honor at the funeral rites. Mr. Garrahy was a charter member of this organization, and was the first Grand Knight of the local council.

Pat Garrahy was born on July 12, 1873, in the sod shanty erected by his parents, John Garrahy and Bridget Kairn Garrahy, who homesteaded the farm in Wellington where Pat was born and where he lived all his life, in 1869, coming here by ox cart. They were natives of Ireland, as were so many of those early settlers of this community. They all became loyal Americans, but had very tender memories for the old country.

This is a clipping from John's FATHERS obituary indicating he also was a founding charter member of his local council during his life— at a very early stage of our Order.



Supreme Chaplain's Monthly Challenge

"You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself." (Gospel for Oct. 25, Mt 22:37-39)

The connection between these two commandments is unmistakable: We must love both God and our neighbor. They are in keeping with the "new commandment" that Jesus gave us at the Last Supper: "Love one another as I love you" (Jn 15:12). What does it mean to "love one another" as Christ has loved us? Jesus further told his disciples at the Last Supper, "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends" (Jn 15:13). May we lay down our lives daily in love of God and neighbor.

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month, I challenge you to make a small financial sacrifice (such as forgoing a daily cup of coffee, a subscription to a streaming service or eating out one night) and donate the money you save to the poor. Second, I challenge you to show your love for your neighbors by participating in the Faith in Action Coats for Kids program with your council.

Questions for Reflection:

What are some specific ways you can love God with your heart, your soul and you mind? How does laying down your life for another show you love them? What are some small, everyday ways you can lay down your life for God and others?
