

STATE DEPUTY'S MESSAGE

Brothers All,

Thank you, Brother Knights, for taking a few minutes to read this yearend reflection and call to finish forward and Happy New Year!

The motto of the Marine Corps is the very worthy "Semper Fidelis," which means "Always Faithful." This motto fuels and directs their energies to be always faithful to each other, to the Corps, and to America. In his book, The *Way of the SEAL: Think Like an Elite Warrior to Lead and Succeed*, **Mark Divine** divulges the unwritten motto of the SEALs which is "Semper Gumby," meaning "Always Flexible." This motto, a reference to the rubber-toy comic hero who can bend and mold to fit any situation, suggests one reason why SEALs are known to operate in and adapt to the most chaotic scenarios— God bless them and all our women and men in uniform for what they do.

Why do I bring this up?

As we begin our New Year, allow me to turn back 'just for a moment' to reflect when I began my term as your State Deputy for our Columbian Year 2020-2021. Our country was getting knee deep into the pandemic scare, economic downturn, massive civil unrest etc., and people everywhere were looking for the adult in the room to stand up.

→ MONTHLY SYNOPSIS ←

January 2021 – As we begin our new year, we focus on life and the beginning of life as we look forward to the annual March for Life (both state and national). In the turbulent times we live in, we must also focus on the greatest destroyer of spiritual life, which is sin and its antidote in our familiar Act of Contrition.

THE ACT OF CONTRITION

The devil has great power to tempt us into sin – however – the Catechism reminds us that his power is not infinite (CCC, 395). God gives each of us a guardian angel to protect us and He's also provided an instant way to break sin's power over us: through repentance. Repentance is the antidote to sin.

That's why repentance is a necessary element of the Church's Sacrament of Penance. The four elements of a sacramental confession are contrition (repentance); confession of sin; absolution by a priest; and penance in reparation for our sin.



To help us spiritually, the Church gives us a prayer we can easily memorize as our way to express repentance. We call this prayer the Act of Contrition, and all of us (hopefully!) learned some form of this prayer in our cate-

chism classes as children or from our parents.

If not, there is no time like the present. Here is a traditional form of the Act of Contrition, which is both a personal expression of sorrow and a prayer to God.

O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended you, and I detest all my sins, because I dread of the loss of heaven and the pains of hell; but most of all because they offend you, my God, who are all good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve, with the help of your grace, to confess my sins, to do penance, and to amend my life. Amen.

There are slightly different versions of this prayer, but essentially, any good "act of contrition" expresses these seven elements:

- We address our prayer to God because our sin offends Him specifically.
- We are "heartily" sorry, meaning that our repentance is from the heart, not just an idea in the mind or a superficial sentiment.
- We hate ("detest") sin because it is the devil's work, not God's. Note that this is not a hatred of ourselves but of our sinful acts.
- We also humbly acknowledge the truth that mortal sins can buy us a direct ticket to hell if we do not repent of them.
- We understand that the love of God is the primary reason we repent – we regret offending Him "who is all good" and who deserves a better response from us.
- We make a firm act of the will ("firmly resolve") to get our moral lives back on track and never to sin again as we repent and confess. And finally,
- We declare our awareness that we cannot possibly fight the devil on our own without the "help of His grace."

This is the perfect prayer for our spiritual lives, and we should pray it every day. Why is it perfect? Because it puts the essential virtue of humility in the place of the sin of pride that causes both angels and humans to separate themselves from God.

SPIRITUAL CHALLENGE

During the month of January I challenge you to learn the Act of Contrition and/or make sure that your children and those entrusted to your care know it well. The subject of sin is never an easy topic, but we can become apostles of the Church's mission of saving souls by reminding ourselves of the importance of fighting sin through repentance.

BIBLE BASICS -



2 Samuel 12:13

Then David said to Nathan, "I have sinned against the LORD." Nathan answered David: "For his part, the LORD has removed your sin. You shall not die.

Psalm 51:9.11-12

Cleanse me with hyssop, that I may be pure; wash me, and I will be whiter than snow. Turn away your face from my sins; blot out all my iniquities. A clean heart create for me, God; renew within me a steadfast spirit.

But he was pierced for our sins, crushed for our iniquity. He bore the punishment that makes us whole, by his wounds we were healed.

After John had been arrested, Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God: "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel."

John 20:19-23

On the evening of that first day of the week, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

1 Peter 4:1-2

Therefore, since Christ suffered in the flesh, arm yourselves also with the same attitude (for whoever suffers in the flesh has broken with sin), so as not to spend what remains of one's life in the flesh on human desires, but on the will of God.

FAITH FUNDAMENTALS -

Two Types of Sin

There are many ways to sin but only two types of sin. "All wrongdoing is sin," says the Apostle John, "but there is sin that is not deadly" (1 John 5:17). John's teaching is the biblical basis for the Church's understanding of the two types of sin: mortal and venial.

How do we know for sure whether *a particular sin* is mortal or venial? The Church gives us three criteria for evaluating sin. We can know an act is *mortally* sinful if it consists of:

- Grave matter namely, a serious violation of God's commandments.
- Full knowledge that is, an understanding of the wrongness of the act.
- Deliberate consent meaning that one is not forced by people or circumstances to commit it.

When an act is a venial sin, it lacks one or more of these criteria, or it is much less serious in any of these three areas.

CATECHISM CONNECTION -



1871 Sin is an utterance, a deed, or a desire contrary to the eternal law. It is an offense against God. It rises up against God in a disobedience contrary to the obedience of Christ.

1872 Sin is an act contrary to reason. It wounds man's nature and injures human solidarity.

1873 The root of all sins lies in man's heart. The kinds and the gravity of sins are determined principally by their objects.

1874 To choose deliberately - that is, both knowing it and willing it - something gravely contrary to the divine law and to the ultimate end of man is to commit a mortal sin. This destroys in us the charity without which eternal beatitude is impossible. Unrepented, it brings eternal death.

1875 Venial sin constitutes a moral disorder that is reparable by charity, which it allows to subsist in us.

OVERVIEW AND PURPOSE:

As the lay faithful, we are called to bring Christ into the world and to make Him known in and through all that we do. Your council activity should always seek new ways to fulfill this mission. The Faith in Action program guidelines allow for each council to mold the programs to meet the unique needs and interests of Knights and the community. There are many within your community who may not be able to participate in these programs and activities physically but could do so digitally or online. This presents an opportunity for your council to enhance existing and future programming by adding a digital/remote programming component. This resource and style of programming does not replace the current model or guidelines for Faith in Action programs. All program guide sheets and specifications should still be followed. While In-person programming is and should always be the preference and norm, remote programming is meant to add on to and enhance current program guidelines and requirements. The "Steps and Best Practices" listed below are intended to help your council think creatively and plan proactively as you work to enhance your programs through remote access. It is 100% up to the council if they choose to implement some or all of the programs remotely.

This tool is laid out as a check list. Not every box is required but should be helpful to the process of adding remote enhancements to every council program. The Supreme Council is happy to provide this tool to enhance your council's capacity to fulfill the mission of the Order and the vision of Blessed Michael McGivney as we work together to build the Kingdom of God.



2020-2021 Council Level Free Throw Competition

The Knights of Columbus Free Throw competition provides a fun athletic outlet for young people ages 9 to 14 and encourages the values of sportsmanship and healthy competition. Because of Covid-19 restrictions, the State Council has made adjustments as to how the free throw competition will be run this year. Please see the instructions below.

Instructions for Remote Council Level Free-Throw Competition

- 1. Parents and legal custodians are encouraged to locate a basketball court to record their child's free throw competition attempts in safe manner, socially distanced from others. The competitions will be done solo this year, not in a group setting and will be recorded.
- 2. The basketball hoop used for the free throws can be in a park, schoolyard or it can be a driveway with a basketball hoop.
- 3. Please get as close to the ball size, hoop height and distance specifications as possible. We want the children to participate! Get as close as you can to be uniform and fair but we encourage all children to participate.
- 4. Participants are encouraged to practice beforehand, but to ensure fairness, parents/custodians should video record and submit only ONE official attempt.
- 5. The parent will fill out the scorecard after videoing, attest to the accuracy of the score by signature and submit by email the filled out, verified score card and video file to the council free-throw chairman.
- 6. Please name the video file with the following format, **council** # **dot child's last name dot child's first name**. (Example): 12345.Smith.Tommy.
- 7. Ages 9, 10, 11 (Boys & girls competitions) are recommended to use a women's regulation-size basketball and shoot from a 12-foot foul line at a 10-foot-high basket.(note: the normal foul line is 15 feet from the basket).
- 8. Ages 12, 13, 14 (girls competitions) are recommended to use a women's regulation-size basketball and shoot from the regulation foul line 15 feet from a 10-foot-high basket.
- 9. Ages 12, 13, 14 (Boys competitions) are recommended to use a men's regulation-size basketball and shoot from the regulation foul line 15 feet from a 10-foot-high basket.
- 10. After practice, each contestant receives 15 consecutive free throw attempts from the appropriate age-designated foul line. The attending parent/custodian videos the attempts. 

The best gifts are those that are personal and uniquely selected for the recipient. Therefore, we Brother Knights must also personalize our offer of the "Gift of Membership This Season" so it is tailored to the needs and interests of our Prospects. Here is how to do that:

When you meet a Catholic man who is not a Knight, get to know him. Ask about his life, his family, his interests. Try to discover what are some of the activities that he, his family, and his friends like to do. Inquire about each of our Faith in Action categories to get to know him better.

- Faith Find out what kind of prayer and spiritual activities are important to him and his family. Mention some of the Faith programs that your Council organizes and supports and ask if he and his family would like to participate.
- o **Family** What does his family do to have fun and to bond? Invite him and his family to some of your Council's Family programs.
- o **Community** Discuss some of the Community programs that the Knights have organized and sponsored in your parish. Let your Prospect know that a family that joins in community service together is bonding in a way that strengthens the family along with providing much needed service.
- o **Life** Review some of the activities that your Council has done to support life. Be sure to talk about Pro Life activities, Special Olympics or other activities that help people with intellectual disabilities, service to the elderly and all actions that show our support of Life from birth until natural death.

Our "Gift of Membership This Season" will be accepted and cherished if you can find his "Hot Buttons." What is it that motivates him and his family?

The Knights have programs for every important activity that interests him. Good Catholic men will be drawn in by our focus on Faith and Family. Therefore, keep Faith and Family foremost in your conversation at all times.

The strength and Growth of our Council's is so important. It all starts today and it all starts with you. Give this Great Gift to every Catholic man you know and ask him to bring his family with him....

Fraternity Includes Retention

Worthy Brothers,

Think about your own family. Would you ever consider kicking your mother, father, sister, or brother out of your family?

The most common reason that our K of C Brothers are kicked out is about money. Keep in mind that we are a FRATERNITY (that is Brotherhood) and we are based on CHARITY (offering service and money when needed).

FRATERNITY - Before we suspend a Brother because he failed to pay his dues we need to act like a family and make personal contact with our Brother. If we do not meet with him face-to-face (or at least by phone) we cannot call ourselves Brothers! We need to find out his situation: what is happening in his life right now, why is he not active in the Council, what was his motivation for joining the Order in the first place and does he still have that feeling?

A well-run Retention Team should use the attached "Worthy Shepherd's Caller Script" or Worthy Shepherds & Apostles COVID-19 Wellness Check Script to assess each Brother's situation (attached). We need to keep in constant contact with all of our Brothers – three or four times each year – every single Brother should be contacted. Our Brothers need to feel that they are tied to the Order almost as strongly as they are tied to their family members.

CHARITY – Part of the "Caller Script" includes determining if our Brother or his family has need of support. By contacting each Brother multiple times each year, we may discover that the Brother or his family may be experiencing financial setbacks. If this is the case, Charity Begins At Home! We need to waive his dues and find other ways to support him. Be sure to ask, when contacting a "Lost Brother" if he or his family is in need of prayer. Bring any prayer requests back to the Council. Believe in and utilize the power of prayer.

Those Councils that are in constant contact with each of their Brothers are showing a true "Intent to Retain."

Please Brothers, let us make this the standard procedure for all Councils in California. Let us talk to each and every Brother quarterly (3-4 times each year). Let him feel the Brotherhood so he knows that ours is the Order that knows him and his family and cares.

Brothers who feel connected to the Knights of Columbus will gladly pay their dues, if they can, because they feel they are a part of a real Brotherhood.
