
Faith Formation Companion to Prayers in the Pew™

→ MONTHLY SYNOPSIS ←

April 2021 – The month of April begins in the middle of Holy Week, where we contemplate the mysteries of our salvation in a profound way. The rest of the month is a celebration of Easter. Let us adore Christ and embrace the full mystery of the Catholic faith, from time into eternity.

THE ANIMA CHRISTI

Although it is not commonly known, there are more ordained priests in the Church's calendar of saints than any other class of saint. Holiness is not limited to priests, by any means, but there is probably a reason for such uncommon priestly sanctity. Because of their sacramental ministry, priests remain close to the Divine Mysteries all their lives.



St. Ignatius Loyola

Among all the prayers that priests have composed throughout the centuries, one of these prayers stand out. The Spanish priest, St. Ignatius Loyola (1491-1556), was founder of the Jesuit order and a man who spent his life teaching people the value of their souls. His spiritual treatise, *The Spiritual Exercises* is a common manual for retreats even to this day. Ignatius gave his religious order the sacred Name of Jesus because of his intense devotion to the Lord.

St. Ignatius' most famous prayer, the *Anima Christi*, is a marvelous spiritual reflection on the Passion of Christ. The title is Latin, translated as "Soul of Christ", which is the first phrase of the prayer.

ANIMA CHRISTI

Soul of Christ, sanctify me.
Body of Christ, save me.
Blood of Christ, inebriate me.
Water from Christ's side, wash me.
Passion of Christ, strengthen me.
O good Jesus, hear me.
Within Thy wounds hide me.
Suffer me not to be separated from Thee.
From the malicious enemy defend me.
In the hour of my death call me.
And bid me come unto Thee.
That I may praise Thee with Thy saints and with Thine angels.
Forever and ever. Amen.

Notice that the prayer touches on the entire sacred humanity of Jesus: His Body and Soul, as well as the Blood and water that flowed from His side. These elements symbolize the Eucharist and the whole sacramental life of the Church.

The Anima Christi is also a very personal prayer to Jesus that anyone can pray with heartfelt devotion. Together with St. Ignatius, we ask Him to save us from the power of the evil one and to lead us through the problems of life to the Kingdom of God, where we hope to share eternity with Him.

This prayer is short enough to be memorized. Let this be your challenge in the Easter Season!

SPIRITUAL CHALLENGE

The Easter Season is a time to focus the eyes of our hearts on the Resurrection and remind ourselves that Christ is the Lord of the living and the dead. I challenge you to attend the Holy Week liturgies and meditate on Four Last Things this month and make sure you are prepared for that moment when you are called from this life to the next.

BIBLE BASICS



Daniel 12:2 Many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake; some to everlasting life, others to reproach and everlasting disgrace.

Matthew 25:31-33 When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit upon his glorious throne, and all the nations will be assembled before him. And he will separate them one from another, as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will place the sheep on his right and the goats on his left.

2 Corinthians 5:10 For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may receive recompense, according to what he did in the body, whether good or evil.

FAITH FUNDAMENTALS -

Four Last Things

The Church always tells us what we need to hear, not always what we want to hear. This is especially true of the doctrine of the Four Last Things: Death, Judgment, Heaven and Hell. The Church wants us to think about what comes after this earthly life now before we actually come face to face with these realities at the end of our earthly lives.

Death is a certainty for all mortal beings. It is not just a physical reality but also a spiritual passage. It is that moment when our souls separate from our bodies and our spiritual destiny is fixed for all eternity.

Next comes Judgment. There is the immediate judgment of our souls, which the Church calls the "particular judgment". This is followed by the "general judgment" at the end of time where Christ will come "to judge the living and the dead" as we profess in the Creed.

At the moment of death, each of us will make one of two choices that will determine our eternal fate: either Heaven or Hell. Humans are endowed with free will, and our eternal destiny is fixed by our own choice. Where will you choose to spend eternity?

California State Council Annual State Meeting 2021

Status of our Annual State Meeting

As our Worthy State Deputy **Steve Bolton** mentioned in his April 2021 video message, the California State Council will be holding our Annual State Meeting (formerly called the State Convention) in May.

The State Council is required by our State By-Laws to hold our Annual State Meeting (formerly called the State Convention) on the third weekend of May to conduct the necessary business of the State Council. That mostly includes the Election of State Officers, Election of Delegates and Alternate Delegates to the Supreme Convention in August, voting on the resolutions that have been submitted by the local councils throughout the state for consideration, and approval of the State Council budget for Columbian Year 2021 - 2022. That will once again happen this year, but rather than having a virtual only meeting as we were mandated to do last year, we will have a unique hybrid version this year. The State Council will still arrange for a virtual opportunity for those who would prefer to attend virtually from home, but we will also allow for a limited number of Council delegates to attend in person. That will likely be limited to 100 Council delegates of the normal 600 delegates that we have seen in the past. That is why it is still vitally important that each local Council designate two delegates to attend the Annual State Meeting, whether it be in person at the Visalia Marriott, or virtually from a remote location.

The date of the Annual State Meeting is Friday and Saturday, May 21 and 22, 2021 at the Visalia Marriott in the Central Valley, south of Fresno and north of Tulare off Highway 99 and east ten miles on Highway 198. Our Annual State Meetings are set for the third Friday of May each year, so this is the latest that we can ever hold the Annual State Meeting and it turns out to be the fourth weekend of May.

The tentative schedule includes an Opening Mass Friday morning at 8:00 a.m. and a Closing Mass Saturday afternoon at 4:00 p.m. In addition to the required business noted above to be voted on, we still plan on having a Parade of Grand Knights presenting checks to Columbian Charities, an Awards Session, and will be providing free entertainment on Friday evening at the Visalia Marriott.

We are planning on inviting the top twelve District Deputies and top eight Chapter Presidents as well who would like to attend the Annual State Meeting in person. We plan on sending out the room reservation link directly to the invitees only.

The State Officers and Team are looking forward to a great Annual State Meeting this year as we transition back to a more typical Annual State Meeting in 2022.



Assembly Elections and Award Resources

ELECTIONS For Assembly Officers Article VIII / Section 24.

(j) Elections.

The regular election of officers in Assemblies shall take place annually at the first regular business meeting of the assembly held in May of each year. The officers then elected all hold office for the term of one year except the faithful trustees whose election is for a three-year term and until their successors are elected and qualified. Such officers shall take office, with or without installation, at the first regular meeting of each assembly in July following their election. Such officers shall be installed not later than the first regular meeting in October of each year. Special elections to fill vacancies may be held on one week's notice. The provisions of the laws as to council elections shall apply as far as practicable. The Faithful Navigator shall within ten days after the election, file report of the same, together with the names and addresses of all officers elected, with the Master of the District, and shall send a duplicate to the Supreme Secretary.





SUPREME CHAPLAIN'S MONTHLY CHALLENGE



Each month, Archbishop William Lori – Supreme Chaplain of the Knights of Columbus – selects a brief passage from the Gospel reading of one of the Sunday Masses of the month.

Archbishop Lori shares a brief reflection on the passage and issues a challenge for men to live for the month.

The next month, men undertaking the challenge as a group gather and share their experiences living the challenge.

The Supreme Chaplain's Monthly Challenge is ideally done during monthly Knights of Columbus meetings, but can be done in a separate group or individually.

By taking up the Supreme Chaplain's Monthly Challenge, men take direct, concrete action to grow in their faith and help their brothers do so as well.

Supreme Chaplain's Monthly Challenge

While they were still speaking about this, he stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." But they were startled and terrified and thought that they were seeing a ghost. Then he said to them, "Why are you troubled? And why do questions arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet, that it is I myself." (Gospel for April 18, Lk 24:36-39)

After Jesus rose from the dead, the apostles were confused and afraid. But showing them his wounds, Jesus proved his identity. Whenever we find ourselves confused or fearful, let us remember that Christ is risen, and that it was "by his wounds we were healed" (Is 53:5). If Christ had not suffered and died, he could not have risen from the dead: without Good Friday; there would be no Easter Sunday. May we unite our suffering to Christ's, rejoice always in his resurrection and base our lives on his peace and presence among us.

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month, ideally on Good Friday, I challenge you to visit your local parish and pray the Stations of the Cross. Second, I challenge you to participate in the Faith in Action Good Friday Family Promotion program to aid your fellow parishioners in remembering Christ's passion, in anticipation of his resurrection.

Questions for Reflection:

When you are suffering, do you tend to find yourself forgetting God or drawing closer to him? What does it mean to "offer it up" when we are suffering? How does the reality of Christ's resurrection offer us comfort, peace and hope during the trials and tribulations of this life?
