

One Life LA was also held on Saturday January 20, 2018 in downtown Los Angeles. Most Reverend Jose H. Gomez, Archbishop of Los Angeles attended along with over 30,000 participating in the walk. California State Secretary Joe Salaiz, State Advocate Steve Bolton and State Warden Dr. Noel Panlilio along with their wives also participated in the walk. That evening a special Requiem Mass for the Unborn was conducted with Archbishop Gomez as the primary celebrate. Mass was held at Our Lady of the Angels Cathedral. Over 50 Color Corps members from throughout Southern California were there in colors to honor the unborn.





40 Days for Life South Bay will celebrate Mass on Sunday February 11, 2018 at several parishes throughout South San Diego County. After Mass, there will be a prayer service on the sidewalk in front of Planned Parenthood in Chula Vista. On Ash Wednesday, February 14, 2018, the Vigil begins at 12:01 AM and continues 24 hours per day for 40 days. This is just one example of the many 40 Days for Life Vigils being conduct-

State Deputy's Message January 2018

HAPPY NEW YEAR! Hopefully everyone had a wonderful Christmas and a Blessed New Year. Since we are just done with our 1st half of the Columbian Year, let us look back at what we have accomplished for the first six months. We had accomplished Chapter Installations and Testimonials during the first four months as well as conducted State Deputy Forums. I thank you for the tremendous hospitality you have given us during our visits.

The first half of the year was kind of slow for California jurisdiction as we are behind in our goals. Our Membership Intake was only 1,474 new members (33.69%). We need 2,901 new members to achieve our goal of 4,375. Our Net gain is 681 (22.25%). We need 2,379 for our goal of 3,060. So far we have one new council (13 to go) and 30 Round Tables (need 110 more toward our goal of 140).

We had conducted several programs during the first half of the year. We had the Family Week in August where councils held family events. The Silver Rose Program was hosted by eleven Chapters during August and September. Our State Officers and Directors as well as brother knights witnessed the ribbon cutting ceremony for the Fr. McGivney Lounge at St. Patrick Seminary. The renovation was funded by the Knights of Columbus. The Ultrasound Program had seven applications during the first half of the year and six checks have been received from Supreme. Other events conducted were Priesthood Sunday, Intellectual Disabilities Drives, Special Olympics, Coats for Kids, Food for Families, Habitat for Humanity, Soccer Challenge, Wheelchair Mission, Christmas Essay. The most notable program for the first six months is the Veterans Assistance Program. The San Diego Diocese Chapter has helped in the event they call the Marine Corps Trial. This is a Paralympic event in which solely Wounded Warriors compete in various sporting events. Brother Knights provided water, snacks and volunteered in different capacities at the different sporting events. Brother Knights also volunteered and helped in other events for our veterans during this first half of the Columbian year.

As we go through this second half of the Columbian Year, let us energized ourselves and focus on inviting eligible catholic men to join our Order. Let us help our councils in their recruiting efforts and help them look forward to achieving the most coveted award they can get and that is the Star Council Award. Let's rev up our Membership Machines and help "Grow The Order". Our Motto this year is "Jesus I Trust In You". We can do it because we entrust the remaining months of the Columbian Year to Jesus, the Divine Mercy. I trust in you that we will achieve our goals this year. Let's work together to achieve these goals. I know you can do it, "We Can Do It".

At the District Deputy Mid-Year Meeting, our Convention Chairman, Greg Marracq, distributed a "Pre Con Book", a preview of our State Convention in Sacramento on May 17-19, 2018. Our Theme is "Faith, Family and Friends". Thursday's events will start with the Golf Tournament, followed by "The Great Barbecue Cook Off Competition". Friday will be the Opening Mass concelebrated by His Excellency Archbishop Salvatore Cordileone of the Archdiocese of San Francisco and His Most Reverend Bishop Jaime Soto of Sacramento Diocese. Friday Night Entertainment will feature an American Bandstand Theme with the Time Bandits. Saturday's Ladies Luncheon will be "Mardi Gras Time" as its theme. Closing Mass on Saturday will be celebrated by His Most Reverend Bishop Emeritus William Weigand of Sacramento. Reserve early and I look forward to celebrating with you and your families.

One of the primary business responsibilities of delegates to the State Council Annual Meeting (convention) is the consideration and approval of resolutions submitted by councils throughout the state. A resolution can be used to: 1) propose/recommend a change in the State or Supreme bylaws, or 2) congratulate a member, priest or parish on reaching a significant milestone (e.g. 50th anniversary of ordination, 60th anniversary of the parish, or 25 years of membership in the Order).

The purpose of this letter is to make your council aware that guidelines for submitting resolutions from your council have been posted on the State Council website at www.californiakniqhts.org/resolutions. You will also find sample templates in Word that can be used to facilitate creating a resolution.

We also want to make you aware that we are modifying the process of publicizing all resolutions that are submitted which will reduce the overall cost burden. The resolutions received for consideration will only be sent to each council and delegate in PDF format by electronic mail. Each Grand Knight, Financial Secretary, and registered convention delegate or alternate will receive that email.

A mailing label with the GK and FS electronic mail addresses currently on record is attached to this letter. Any corrections to these electronic mail addresses should be sent immediately to state.office@californiakniqhts.org. The delegate election forms are also being modified to collect the email addresses of the elected delegates and alternates.

As the Chairman of the Resolutions Committee, I want to do everything possible to ensure that the resolution process runs smoothly and provide whatever help is needed in your understanding of that process.



Candidates for State Office at the Annual State Meeting (Convention), wishing to participate in the State Office mailing, must have their resolutions into the State Office no later than Friday, February 9, 2018.

Council endorsement resolutions must be signed by the council **Grand Knight** and **Recording Secretary** and have the council seal affixed.

The original <u>must</u> be mailed to the State Office. It is strongly recommended that an electronic copy of the resolution, in Microsoft Word format, also be provided. E-mail to: state.office@californiaknights.org

This year, 'Council Endorsements' will be sent along with the Resolutions "booklet" that will be distributed by electronic mail to each council 45 days prior to the annual State Meeting. If you have any questions, please call the State Office at 909-434-0460.

Guidelines for Elections:

- 1. A candidate may prepare a short biography which may be featured on the State Council's web site.
- If a candidate's council passes a resolution of support for a particular candidate, that resolution can be disseminated to the other councils within the candidate's council.
- A candidate may not mass mail (either US Mail or e-mail) members of the Knights of Columbus or the general public.
- 4. In the event a candidate's council passes a resolution in support of a particular candidate, that resolution can also be posted on the State Council's web site.



Frank Nigro Columbian Foundation Supporting People with Intellectual Disabilities, Inc. Chosen to Receive \$2,500 Grant

Frank Nigro Columbian Foundation Chosen by Local Staples Associate to Benefit from Staples Foundation Grant

John Brennan of Knights of Columbus Fair Oaks Council 6066 identified our School Partner-ship Program as qualifying for Grant. Dr. Ray Warriner comment on the award "I spent much of my youth and early adult life suffering from low self-esteem. It was only through a loving wife and God that I was able to break away from that destructive affliction. So, I know from personal experience the importance of developing a positive self-image at an early age. **That is what the School Partnership Program is all about.**"

"This human characteristic is even more important with children, especially those with intellectual disabilities. This grant request will support and expand programs focused on developing healthy and positive self-esteem for K-12 students with disabilities. If you choose this request for approval, it represents support for 10 classrooms of 20 to 30 Special Education Students being provided an opportunity to improve their self-esteem and impacts theirs lives and the lives of those around them for many years to come."

The grants are part a philanthropic initiative which allows Staples associates around the world to direct funding to non-profit organizations focused on academic education or job skills. The program encourages local community engagement by awarding larger grants to organizations where associates are highly engaged in volunteering or fundraising – up to \$25,000 per organization.

In 2016, Staples awarded more than \$2.3 million in grants to 1,000 local organizations in support of education and job skills programs.

For over 60 years California Columbian Charities has provided kindness and generosity to California Knights by fulfilling Father McGivney's mandate of **BROTHER HELPING BROTHER**.

In the past the Charity has responded to almost 2200 requests to provide Brothers with their family's critical needs and has given more than \$3,000,000 in relief. In 2017 Columbian Charities responded to 68 requests from Brothers and widows with 52 grants and \$135,000 in aid.

If you know of a Brother who is in severe financial distress please ask his council's **Grand Knight** to contact the State Council office for Charity application forms, **(909) 434-0460**, or **state.office@californiaknights.org**.

We need your generous charitable and fraternal support to continue assisting Brothers who cannot provide for themselves. For several of the past years donations to the charity have been much less than what was needed to meet the needs of our many Brothers who had suffered because of the poor economy. This is a California State Council program. Supreme does not provide any funds.

The "365 Club" and the Parade of Grand Knights are the primary methods of raising funds for California Columbian Charities. We ask that every Brother in California join the "365 Club" and donate a penny a day - either by adding an additional \$3.65 (or more) to their dues payment, or by a cash donation at council meetings. The council may hold these funds until May when they should be brought to the State Convention and the Parade of Grand Knights.

If a council misses the convention it should not overlook its donation. Please mail all council and personal checks (payable to Californian Columbian Charities) to California Columbian Charities, P. O. Box 4256, Cerritos, CA 90703. These donations may be sent at any time.

Although the "365 Club" and Parade of Grand Knights involve only one donation a year at the State Convention, further donations are appreciated by Columbian Charities and by your Brothers in distress.

Thank you for your generosity.

Every Council's Financial Secretary should introduce the Council members to the "365 Club" so that all Brothers have the ability to contribute to Columbian Charities. To join each Brother is asked to donate a penny a day (\$3.65 or more, per year) to the Charity. The best way to accomplish this is for the Financial Secretary to add an additional line to the dues billing statement (including those sent to non-dues paying Honorary Members): "365 Club – Please add a \$3.65 donation to Columbian Charities." This will provide every Brother in the Council an opportunity to support our charity.

We urge Councils to start employing the "**365 Club**" option during their next dues billing cycle. Financial Secretaries have many responsibilities in carrying out their duties; however, Brothers are losing their jobs, their health insurance and their homes during hard times. We need to extend to them a helping hand and we know that every Brother in every Council wants to participate.

January 2018 Message

This month Operations is focusing on **Ceremonials**. Ceremonials remain of primary importance in promoting the growth and vitality of the Knights of Columbus. Ceremonials welcome new members into our Order and guide them in their advancement while teaching the fundamental lessons of who we are and what our mission is. Experience has shown that members are more likely to remain active in our Order if they have taken their Admission Degree (First), Formation Degree (Second) and Knighthood Degree (Third) in a timely manner.

Proposers are asked to attend ceremonials with their candidates. This not only shows the new member that he is supported by his brother Knights, but also renews the existing member's understanding of who we are and what we stand for.

The Admission Degree (First) is of prime importance in the life of a member of the Knights of Columbus. It is imperative that the best possible impression be made upon the candidate during this Degree. There is only one opportunity to make the first impression upon a candidate. The Admission Degree (First) is the gateway to membership and a passport to the other Degrees.

Degree teams must strictly conform to the ceremonials. The proper paraphernalia must be available and properly used. In order for a team to be certified, all parts must be memorized. The need for team practice cannot be over emphasized. Additions, omissions, changes or innovations of any kind are absolutely forbidden.

In January of 2014, Supreme Knight, Carl Anderson, made available a video DVD for councils to utilize when bringing in new members. This DVD presentation is designed to aid any Council: (#1) lacking a First Degree team, and where there are no other First Degree ceremonials within a reasonable driving distance that a candidate can be transported in order to take the degree, and (#2) special circumstances where a candidate cannot attend any available First Degree ceremonial. The DVD ceremonial presentation site must be dignified and solemn. It is preferable to have as many members present to observe and support each candidate. All laws and procedures as to the proper admittance of new members remain in effect.

The Admission Degree (First) is under the direct control of the Grand Knight of the Council. All Councils are encouraged to establish their own First Degree Team and to hold frequent Admission Degrees. Our Worthy Membership Director always reminds us that "Two weeks is too late". Don't let a candidate wait for the next available Admission Degree. Utilize the DVD if necessary or attend an Admission Degree near you within that timeframe if you don't have a Degree Team.

The Formation Degree (Second) is under the control of the District Deputy. The District Deputy is also responsible for coordinating and hosting Knighthood Degrees (Third).

All Chapters are encouraged to appoint a Chapter Ceremonials Chairman. Although it is no longer necessary for the Chapter President and the Chapter Ceremonials Chairman to sign the request for a Knighthood Degree Conferring Officer and Staff, the Chairman is responsible to work with the District Deputies and Grand Knights in coordinating and scheduling Third Degrees. The Chairman will establish and publish a list of all First, Second and Third Degrees scheduled within the Chapter.

It is imperative that effective communication be established and maintained to ensure successful Ceremonial work. Should you have any questions, you are encouraged to contact the State Ceremonials Chairman or your Regional Ceremonials Consultant.

Mexican Martyr Monthly Award for Chaplains Three Phases that lead to Priestly Vocations

<u>Dec. 15, 2017</u> is the deadline for nominating your chaplain for the December 2017 Mexican Martyr Chaplain Award. This award represents Phase 3 of the Knights of Columbus commitment to Vocations. It is one of the easiest programs available to give recognition to your chaplain and say thanks for his yes to your council or assembly. Please take the time to fill out the nomination form. You will receive a certificate or plaque to give to him at your council meeting. Forms are available on state website. http://www.californiaknights.org/state-forms/

Phase 1: Vocation Awareness: **A Call to Serve Vocation Program** is the California Program recommended for vocation awareness.

This program asks Knights, their wives and families to be conscious of prospective men who might have a vocation to the priesthood. Look around prior to Mass and look for that single man who seems to be intently involved in prayer. Simply approach him after Mass and give him the Vocation Prayer Card and ask him if he has ever considered a vocation to the priesthood.

Phase 2: Supporting our seminarians during their formation. The RSVP & Adopt A Seminarian Program are the recommended programs for California Councils and Assemblies

The California Vocation Team is recommending that councils mold these 2 programs into one. Through the RSVP select a seminarian and contribute financially to help him with his personal expenses while he is in formation. Through the Adopt A Seminarian Program contact your parish EDD Coordinator and School Principal and share with them what the program is all about and them to solicit a classroom to participate.

Phase 3: Giving thanks to our priests especially those who have said yes to you to be your council or assembly chaplain. **The Mexican Martyr and Fr. Juan Perez Awards** are the two programs your California Vocation Team recommends.





Knights of Columbus Council's 9580 and 11804 Distribute over 1,000 Coats

Pajaro, CA — Resurrection Knights of Columbus Council 9580 gave over 1000 brand new coats to Pajaro and kids on Thursday, December 21st and Saturday, December 23rd.

Children from all over Pajaro, just south of Watsonville, came to Casa de la Cultura Center and left wearing perfectly fitted, warm, and stylish coats. Present at the distribution were Knights of Columbus Councils 9580 in Aptos and Council 11804 in Watsonville, youth

from Palma High School in Salinas, staff from Casa de la Cultura as well as staff from Driscoll's Berry Farm, food donations from Whole Foods Market, and the Most Reverend Richard Garcia, Bishop of the Diocese of Monterey.

This distribution was part of a national program sponsored by the Knights of Columbus. Coats are procured in bulk and shipped to local councils throughout North America. Each coat has an estimated retail value of \$70. Since the program began in 2009, nearly 400,000 coats have been distributed.

Sister Rosa Delores Rodriguez from Casa de la Cultura Center sent out the coat request in October. The Council

started taking small donations after an anonymous donor challenged the Council to match a \$5000 cash donation to support Sister Rosa's program. Resurrection Catholic Community in Aptos allowed the Knights to do a pulpit announcement and donation collection after all the masses the weekend before Thanksgiving. Thanks to the very generous donations of Resurrection parishioners in addition to the matching fund, the Council collected a record \$20,000, which was used to purchase almost 1100 brand new coats. Historically the Council had purchased coats for Sister Rosa's program but, due to the tremendous outpouring of donations, Sister Rosa asked that the Council purchase additional coats for children of families impacted by the wildfires in Napa and Santa Rosa as well as Jacob's Heart Cancer Support Services in Santa Cruz. The



Council reached out to Redwood Chapter Knights of Columbus and coordinated distribution with Brother Knight John Zikmund for the additional coat distribution in Napa and Santa Rosa, sending 216 additional coats. Another 96 coats were sent to needy boys and girls at All About Children, a foster children's program in Oroville.

We wish to thank the many people who made this program successful. We especially want to thank our Council Chairman, Past Grand Knight Patrick McMenamy. Patrick worked tirelessly on getting the orders placed at Knights Gear and working directly with Jason Porrello at the Supreme Council. Patrick also was the contact person with the various organizations that we had coats shipped to outside of our community. We also had many volunteers that worked on the distribution of the coats including Grand Knight Larry Gonzales, Past Grand Knight Larry Young, Grand Knight Richard Sanchez, Past Grand Knight Greg Caput and many other Brother Knights and friends of the Councils in Aptos and Watsonville.
