WILDFIRE SUPPORT - COLUMBIAN CHARITIES

My Brothers Knights of California,

Following is an update on the wildfires burning in California. The two of greatest concern remain the Woolsey Fire in southern California, which currently stands at 97,620 acres, and the Camp Fire in northern California which has burned 135,000 acres. The Camp Fire has proven by far to be the most destructive and deadly devastating the entire northern California town of Paradise, a community of approximately 30,000 people. It is estimated over 7,000 homes and businesses have been destroyed. The death toll currently stands at 42 known deceased with over 200 people still missing. The California National Guard has been ordered into the community to help search for human remains. Those residents who were able to evacuate safely are currently staying with family or at evacuation shelters in the nearby communities of Chico, Oroville and Gridley.

Paradise is home to Knights of Columbus Council 7773. It has been confirmed St. Thomas More Catholic Church in Paradise where the council meets is still standing (although it may have sustained damage), but the church hall and rectory have been destroyed. Emergency meetings have been scheduled by the council leadership in Chico, and they are currently attempting to contact all of their members. It has been confirmed at least 22 have lost their homes, and the number is likely to rise as evacuation orders are lifted and residents are allowed to return to the devastated area.

The best way to help those displaced and effected by this tragedy at this time is with financial contributions. You can help by sending your monetary donation to either of the following:

Contributions will be used for direct assistance to Brother Knights who have lost their homes, direct aid to Paradise Council 7773 to replace articles destroyed in the fire and sustain operations, and general humanitarian aid to fire victims, first responders and those effected by the fire.

At this time, evacuation centers have been overwhelmed by donations of used clothing and no more is being accepted. Contributions of new clothing (including Coats for Kids) may be dropped of at a depot established by the Salvation Army at the former Koret Warehouse and Distribution Center at the Chico Municipal Airport, 1100 Marauder Street, Chico, CA 95973. It is asked all contributions of clothing be coordinated through the Paradise and/or Chico councils.

Again, as you learn of any confirmed losses please notify the President of California Columbian Charities, Stephen Peterson, who is copied on this message, Second Responders Chairman Joseph Galbraith, or our State Secretary David Abbott. I am grateful for the continuing assistance provided by agents of the Cabral Agency and Owens Agency who have worked tirelessly to contact and assist Brother Knights effected by this crisis.

May God bless the fire fighters, first responders and all those effected by these fires in this most difficult time,

We thank you Lord for all your guidance and blessings, and we continue to place all we do as Knights firmly in Your hands.



PROGRAMS DIRECTOR MESSAGE

Worthy Brothers,

Safe Environment training is NOT an optional activity, it is mandatory and MUST be completed to be eligible for any recognition at the State and Supreme level this Columbian Year. Until the training is completed the Supreme Council has stated that councils must not host activities where children may be present.

Here is a Check list for Safe Environment Compliance.

- ⇒ Officers Chosen for Term form 185 successfully submitted.
- ⇒ Service Program Personnel Report form 365 successfully submitted.
- ⇒ Grand Knight has completed the Safe Environment training (All 3 Courses).
- ⇒ Program Director has completed the Safe Environment training (All 3 Courses).
- ⇒ Family Director has completed the Safe Environment training (All 3 Courses and a back ground check).
- ⇒ Community Director has completed the Safe Environment training (All 3 Courses and a back ground check).

In order to successfully submit the Service Program Personnel Report form 365 the Program Director, Membership Director, Family Director and Community Director Information must be filled out. After the form 365 is successfully submitted the Membership Director, Family Director and Community Director will get an email with instructions on how to complete the Safe Environment requirements. They will have 45 days to complete it or be removed from the position.

It takes a couple of hours to complete the training including the back ground check. Get it done quickly.

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS PRIEST MARTYRS' 2018-19 AWARD OF SERVICE

The California State Council has expanded the Mexican Priest Martyrs' Award to include three more who were martyred: St. Augustine Zhao Rong, a Chinese martyr, St. Lorenzo Ruiz, the First Filipino canonized saint and St. Andrew Dung-Lac, an early Vietnamese Priest who was canonized. Fr. Augustine Zhao Rong, Fr. Lorenzo Ruiz, Fr. Andrew Dung-Lac along with the six Mexican priest who were martyred for their faith during various times of persecution of Christians throughout the world. All of them died because they chose to continue to serve their people despite the threat of death. We want to honor their sacrifice by creating an award in their name that will be given out during the year to the chaplains in California who give of themselves not only to their parish and diocese but also to the Knights as a chaplain.

The Knights of Columbus are forever thankful for the dedicated priests who not only serve their parish or community but who also take the time to serve the Knights of Columbus as chaplains.

The Knights want to honor and thank those dedicated priests for their service throughout the Columbian Year. Each month beginning in August 2018 through March 2019 we will honor the Knights of Columbus Chaplains who have displayed extraordinary service to their Council and Parish. These priests will automatically be considered for the yearly Fr. Juan Perez Award and the Fr. Michael J. McGivney Priest of the Year Award given out at the California State Convention.

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS PRIEST MARTYRS' 2018-19 AWARD OF SERVICE NOVEMBER 2018

St. Andrew Dung-Lac November Honoree for Chaplain Service Award

A Vietnamese diocesan priest who suffered martyrdom is *Andrew Dung-Lac, who is honored by being the representative of the 117 martyrs in the Roman Calendar. His name was originally Dung An Trân, and he was born about 1795 in a poor and pagan family in Bac-Ninh in North Vietnam. When he was twelve the family had to move to Hà-Nôi (Hanoi) where his parents could find work. There he met a catechist and got food and shelter from him. He also got education in Christian faith for three years, and was baptized in Vinh-Tri with the Christian name Andrew (Andrew Dung).

After learning Chinese and Latin he became a catechist, and thereafter taught catechises in the country. He was chosen to study theology, and on 15 March 1823 he was ordained priest. As parish priest in Ke-Dâm he was tireless in his preaching. He often fasted and lived a simple and moral life, he was a good example for the people, and many were baptized.

In 1835 he was imprisoned under emperor Minh-Mang's persecutions (he was called Vietnam's emperor Nero), but his freedom was purchased by donations from members of the congregation he served.

To avoid persecutions, he changed his name to Lac (Andrew Lac) and moved to another prefecture to continue his work. But on 10 November 1839 he was again arrested, this time with Peter Thi, another Vietnamese priest whom he was visiting so that he might go to confession.

Once again Andrew was liberated, along with Peter Thi, in exchange for money. Their freedom was brief. They were soon re-arrested and taken to Hanoi, where both suffered a dreadful torture. Finally, they both were beheaded 21 December 1839. Andrew was beatified in the first group on 27 May 1900.

Rewrite Your Council's Faith Story With the "Five Ps of Success"

SPIRITUALREFLECTION PRODUCT: A retreat for rejuvenation. This could be a "Knights Only" retreat that you plan under the guidance of your chaplain, or it could be an event you organize for men or families of your parish. PRICE: Will vary on the retreat length, style and number of attendees. PLACE: Your parish or a retreat center. PEOPLE: Council members, men of the parish or entire families.

And why PROMOTE it? Religious retreats are radically rejuvenating spiritual events that often leave a lasting impact on relationship to their faith. Yet, too often, retreats seem only to be offered to students and youth. Working with their pastors, Knights of Columbus councils can hold low-cost retreats of their own. It creates annual opportunities for prayer and reflection as a fraternity. It's also a great way to introduce potential recruits to your council.

HOLY HOUR PRODUCT: A regular hour of eucharistic adoration. Prepared for the men of the parish, this Holy Hour could include a reflection, communal rosary, various prayers and hymns with the aid of the pastor or chaplain. PRICE: Just one hour of a man's time; the value to his soul is priceless. PLACE: Your church. PEOPLE: Knights and other members of your parish, especially potential recruits.

And why PROMOTE it? A Holy Hour encourages a personal encounter with God. Now, more than ever, devout Catholics need time to pray. Eucharistic adoration is a way to address these needs. It is familiar, easy to organize and something everyone can participate in together.

To satisfy program requirements, councils must organize a Holy Hour at least four times per fraternal year. However, councils are strongly encouraged to hold Holy Hours even more frequently.

If your council is unable to organize a retreat on its own, you can attend a local Catholic retreat — or visit the Saint John Paul II National Shrine in Washington, D.C. — to satisfy the requirement. However, council attendance should be significant, with at least 10 percent of the council or a minimum of 10 members participating.

The definition of a "reflection" is broad but should be a day-long event at minimum and could possibly encompass an entire weekend. Be creative: Make a pilgrimage to a nearby basilica, monastery or convent. Celebrate Mass with your chaplain or pastor.

Council participation in Spiritual Reflection is required to qualify for Columbian Award.

Every council should be taking steps to implement the new Faith in Action programs, ideally at least one program from each category. See how easy it is to get started by looking at each program considering the 5 Ps (place, price, product, people and promotion).

SACRAMENTAL GIFTS

PRODUCT Gifts to be given to recipients of Baptism, First Communion and Marriage. PRICE: Depends on your gift(s) and the number of recipients. PLACE: Your church. PEOPLE: Your council, your pastor and parishioners.

FAITH ACTIVITIES

As the families become more integrated into the life of the church, they will turn to the Knights, knowing that they are always ready to pray for them, support them and help them.

PLACE: A prominent location in your church or parish hall, provided you get your pastor's permission. And why PROMOTE it? It's important that every parish has exceptional religious education materials available for anyone to study. The Domestic Church Kiosks contain engaging, faith-based booklets, perfect for members, parishioners and the public. Councils purchasing a Kiosk will also receive a set of 225 booklets of the most popular CIS resources aimed at helping Catholics to live out the Church's vision for our families.

Obtain your pastor's permission and, under his direction, plan the best way for you to present the gift. Check out the Sacramental Gifts Brochure (#10727) for details and gift ideas.

Assign a council member to be responsible for receiving and setting up the kiosk and replenishing the booklets when supplies are low. Councils can purchase the refill booklets in bulk at a reduced rate.

REFUND SUPPORT VOCATIONS PROGRAM PRODUCT: The support of seminarians and religious. PRICE: For every \$500 your council gives, the Supreme Council will refund \$100, up to \$400 per seminarian. PLACE: Your parish and community. PEOPLE: Seminarians identified with the help of the jurisdiction RSVP chairman, diocesan vocation director, your council chaplain or parish pastor.

And why PROMOTE it? Men who are in seminary need the moral and spiritual support of the Catholic laity. Knights and our families stand in solidarity with seminarians and those discerning vocations. They need our help, whether that be financial or with our moral support and prayers.

Set an annual goal for your RSVP fundraising efforts. Then conduct various events in your parish and community to reach your goal. Potential fundraising activities include asking your pastor to allow a second collection earmarked to support seminarians or a "Seminarian Breakfast" during which seminarians supported by your council meet the parish and pray together.

INTO THE BREACH PRODUCT: A weekly study group centering on the Into the Breach Booklet (#340) and Study Guide (#10683). PRICE: The cost of providing a copy of the booklet and study guide to each of your study group attendees. Or, they can access both items free online. PLACE: An appropriate meeting venue, such as a parish hall. PEOPLE: Knights and other members of your parish, especially men who may become Knights.

And why PROMOTE it? Times of crisis and uncertainty must be met by Catholics with honesty, integrity and justice, as well as complete dedication to virtue. Bishop Thomas Olmsted's Into the Breach identifies the enemies of the faith — both spiritual and temporal — and draws up a battle plan for us to fight for our own souls, spread the joy of the Gospel, heal the wounds within ourselves and others and steadily transform the world. This program is also a great recruiting tool, so be sure to welcome prospective members to join you each week.

PLACE: Your parish. PEOPLE: Council and parish members can participate in the Marian prayer service.

And why PROMOTE it? The image of Our Lady Help of Persecuted Christians fosters devotion to the Blessed Mother and recalls minding the sufferings of our brothers and sisters in the faith. A prayer service will raise awareness in our larger communities, and better help us stand in prayerful solidarity with persecuted Christians.

Invite each family of the parish and offer those who attend a copy of A Scriptural Rosary for the Family (#319). Councils can schedule services on any day of the week, at any time of the year, with the guidance of their pastor. Councils should hold rosary prayer services at least four times a year to successfully meet program requirements.

FREE THROW COMPETITION

Every year the Knights of Columbus in California sponsor a Basketball Free Throw Championship Competition as our State Tournament. Last year we added a 3 PT shooting for 15-18 old boys and girls. This competition directly involves the winners of each Council, District, and Chapter. The winners at the State Championship become eligible for the International competition, which is sponsored by the Supreme Council. This Supreme competition is based upon the winning scores of individuals at the State level competition, from throughout the order.

The details and rules for the competition are in the Basketball Free Throw Kit (#FT-KIT) which Grand Knights or Council Basketball Chairman, can order "FREE" from Supreme. Also this year if you have any questions concerning the program, you are able to go to the K of C web site and it will answer all your questions. This is a youth program activity, which can be one of your council's most enjoyable and rewarding event that your council can hold each year.

Eligibility:

- All boys and girls ages 9-14 shoot Free Throws,
 PT shooting for boys and girls ages 15-18 as of January 1, 2019 are eligible to compete.
- 2. All contestants must register using the official "K of C" entry form /score sheet (#1598).
- 3. Entry form must have a parent or guardian signature.
- 4. Proof of age, must accompany entry form through all levels of competition.
- 5. Contestants may only participate in one Council competition.
- 6. Winners at the Council level, will advance to the District shoot, District winners will advance to Chapter lev-
- el, and only Chapter winners will be eligible for State competition.

WHY ARE SUBMITTING YOUR REPORTS AND FORMS SO IMPORTANT?

We are asked, on occasion, why do we need to submit these reports? There seem to be so many of them. Also, the deadlines seem so arbitrary. Well, let me try to answer these concerns. Yes, there are many reports to submit. Each one has their own purpose and each one is important not only to your council but also to the bigger picture of the Knights of Columbus. Let's take each one separately.

Form 185 – Report of Officers: This form has several purposes. It tells Supreme and your State Council who is in charge of each of vital areas of running your council. It also is used to send emails and flyers to the key players. This form is needed by your council to ensure that all the key positions are covered. Imagine the effects if your council did not have an Advocate, or a Chancellor. It would add to the inefficiently of your meetings and probably not meeting your membership goals.

Form 365 – Service Program Personnel Report: Programs are the driving force of the success and growth of a council. These are the key programs that must be covered and there needs to be leadership in place to have the program run successfully. By having a brother in charge of each program greatly improves the chances that that program will run smoothly. This list is also needed to find out who are the key players in the areas dealing with youth. This list is used to determine who to send the Safe Environment Training and Certification requirements to.

Form 1295 – Semi-Annual Council Audit: There is an old saying that I have used that has served me well. "Trust but verify". The semi-annual audit does just that. We trust that our council's "Money Men" are keeping the books straight, but we need to be positive. The council depends on this fact, so does State and Supreme. There are horror stories of money mis-management in many businesses and charitable organizations. We want to make sure that we are not one of them. This process insures that. As a side note, if your council does not submit an audit for two consecutive times, then your bonding from Supreme will be removed, and that is a very big deal!

Form 1728 – Annual Survey of Fraternal Activities: If we say that we are a charitable organization that donates hours and money to causes that we believe in, how do we prove that? We prove that by compiling all of the activities that each council does on one form and submit it, with all the other councils within the Knights of Columbus, so Supreme can show that we "Walk the Talk". This not only insures our tax-free status, but it also is great advertisement of how impactful the Knights of Columbus is in our world.

Service Program Monthly Activity Report: The completion and submission of this form each month is of special emphasis. Outside of any newsletter articles and reports at the chapter meetings, there is really no other formal process to see what councils are doing throughout the year. This form is used to tell what activities your council has done that month. It must be submitted to the State Activity Chairman and the State Service Program Director. It is important that they be kept in the loop as to what your council is doing. A side benefit of this is that this form will make it much easier for you, towards the end of the Columbian year, when you submit your STSP-CA for the state awards competition.

STSP-CA - State Council Service Program Awards Entry Form: All the hard work your council has done, throughout the year, needs to be shared with others and should be recognized. This is accomplished by submitting the STSP-CA form. Theses packages are submitted and then compared with other councils in the same division. The best of the best will be recognized at the state convention in San Diego this coming May. Most councils put in a lot of effort to serve their parish and community. They usually get a thank you from the parishioners and/or a pat on the back from their pastor. For many this is more than enough. However, it is also nice to know that all their hard work, when lined up against other councils, is also recognized as one of the best in the State of California. It requires extra effort to put the package together. However, if your council is also submitting the Service program Monthly Activity Report, then the load is greatly reduced.

In conclusion, the forms and reports that must be submitted can be a hassle. But, it is also necessary. There are many parts that need to work to keep this Knights of Columbus machine running smoothly. If each of us do our part, then we will have the assurance that this great organization is accomplishing God's will because of our efforts!

For over 60 years California Columbian Charities has provided kindness and generosity to California Knights by fulfilling Father McGivney's mandate of **BROTHER HELPING BROTHER.**

In the past we have responded to over 2200 requests to provide Brothers with their family's critical needs and have given more than \$3,100,000 in relief. In 2017 Columbian Charities responded to 68 requests from Brothers and widows with 52 grants and \$135,000 in aid.

We need your generous charitable and fraternal support to continue assisting Brothers who cannot provide for themselves. For several of the past years donations to the charity have been much less than what was needed to meet the needs of our many Brothers who had suffered because of the poor economy. This is a California State Council program. Supreme does not provide any funds.

The "365 Club" and the Parade of Grand Knights are the primary methods of raising funds for California Columbian Charities. We ask that every Brother in California join the "365 Club" and donate a penny a day - either by adding an additional \$3.65 (or more) to their dues payment, or by a cash donation at council meetings. The council may hold these funds until May when they should be brought to the State Convention and the Parade of Grand Knights.

If a council misses the convention it should not skip its donation. Please mail all council and personal checks (payable to Californian Columbian Charities) to the above address. These donations may be sent at any time.

Although the "365 Club" and Parade of Grand Knights involve only one donation a year at the State Convention, further donations are appreciated by Columbian Charities and by your Brothers in distress.

<u>Thank you</u> for your generosity.

Every Council's Financial Secretary should introduce the Council members to the "365 Club" so that all Brothers have the ability to contribute to Columbian Charities. To join each Brother is asked to donate a penny a day (\$3.65 or more, per year) to the Charity. The best way to accomplish this is for the Financial Secretary to add an additional line to the dues billing statement (including those sent to non-dues paying Honorary Members): "365 Club – Please add a \$3.65 donation to Columbian Charities." This will provide every Brother in the Council an opportunity to support our charity.

We urge Councils to start employing the "365 Club" option during their next dues billing cycle. Financial Secretaries have many responsibilities in carrying out their duties; however, Brothers are losing their jobs, their health insurance and their homes during hard times. We need to extend to them a helping hand and we know that every Brother in every Council wants to participate.

NEW FINANCIAL SECRETARY OF THE YEAR AWARD

The Financial Secretaries are generally the most utilized and least recognized officers of the councils. Also, though the Financial Secretaries do not directly control suspensions, they have a significant influence on the council's attitude and activity in this area.

The purposes of this award are to motivate Financial Secretaries to:

Use Member Management for billing and council transactions

Submit all Supreme forms on time

Reduce the number of suspended members from their council

Raise the standard of all Financial Secretaries by recognizing the best of the best.

Each Chapter will submit their nomination for their Financial Secretary of the Year based on the criteria below. The 16 nominees will be evaluated and the winner will be determined based upon measurable and subjective criteria. The Financial Secretary of the Year will be recognized on the final night of the State Convention in San Diego.

Award Criteria – Measurable & Required

- Forms 185, 365, 1295 & 1728 must be submitted to Supreme
- Suspended members less than 2.5% of total council membership
- Supreme and State per capita and Chapter dues are paid
- Required council leaders complete their Safe Environment Certification
- Complete required Online Training for Financial Secretaries
- Ties will be based on the council that has the lowest suspension percentage

Award Criteria - Subjective (DD's Suggested Criteria)

- Use of the Membership Management System
- Have the insurance representative promote the insurance program at business meetings at least quarterly. (In cases with no assigned FA, request and read a message from the GA)
- · 990 & 199 tax records submitted
- Financial Secretary sends list of delinquent members to the Retention Committee
- Council's Shepherd & Apostles Program in place

I recently met with a member for the first time who is 90 years young. He asked me to review his policies. He was still physically able, had great sense of humor, and was financially comfortable. He had worked hard during his lifetime resulting in pensions from two different retirements. His house was paid for. His living expenses were covered for the rest of his life. However this isn't the only smart thing this member was able to accomplish on the modest salary he had for all his working years. He proved that the products we offer can be a valuable financial tool.

He believed in Whole Life Insurance enough to purchase three policies at different stages of his life and reaped the benefits of PUAs and cash accumulation. His death benefit from these policies has more than doubled over the years and the cash value is well over the amount of money he paid in premiums. He also has two annuities with the Knights. He used one for life income with a 15-year period that he has been collecting on for 19 years. This allowed his daughter to retire from her job early and take care of both of her parents until her mother passed, now allowing her father live his later years with family. The second annuity is available if need be or just to be added onto the great legacy the life policies will provide.

A Story from the Field

I met with a member's wife in May. She had previously completed a form to surrender her policy. Home Office in New Haven began processing the paperwork. They requested that I verify that the Social Security number. I stopped by to see her and while I was there, I asked about her reason for surrendering her policy. After listening to her, I explained the benefits of keeping the policy. After our discussion, she decided to keep the policy. We had also discussed her husband becoming a Knight and insuring him and their children, just as her grandfather had insured her. We scheduled another appointment. She called a couple of times to reschedule. When I met with her, she again talked about surrendering the policy. Her monthly payment was only \$4. Once again, we discussed the benefits of keeping the policy and insuring her husband and her children. This was on Thursday afternoon and we made an appointment for the next day to meet with her and her husband.

Later that evening I received a text from her saying that tomorrow would not be a good time to meet. Maybe next week, she said. So I texted her on Tuesday and received no response. I tried Wednesday and no response. So I left her a voicemail. Her husband returned the call from her phone. I explained who I was and what his wife wanted to do concerning insuring him and their children. He paused and told me that she passed away on Friday by suicide. After the initial shock, I expressed my condolences and let me know that I was there to help in any way.

I believe that I was meant to meet with her to keep her policy in force for her family.

The Power of Protection

My transition into being a new Knights of Columbus Field Agent has been a vocation invitation almost validated directly by the Holy Spirit Himself. After recently being placed in hospice care in July 2018, my mother passed away very recently in early September 2018, at the very outset of my new career in this field. My father, having been a Knight since the early 1990s, had purchased a life insurance policy for my mother within the past year from his local agent in Orange County. I had not envisioned that one of my initial exposures to a death claim benefit would be as a result of my own mother's passing, but making decisions about her final expenses, in concert with my dad and the funeral home, was easier knowing that her insurance benefit would cover the appropriate expenses. Years of life experience have taught me that combining emotion and trauma is not the best time to make decisions – my father's decisions on behalf of my mother during an extremely difficult emotional period were greatly facilitated knowing that she had a policy in place to cover her final expenses.

I wrote policies on both him and his wife who had breast cancer in the past. He was declined and she was rated, I convinced them to take the policy and they did. Two months later she went to the doctor not feeling well and it was determined that she had cancer and it was terminal. Six months later she passed and the order paid the claim. He was so grateful that I stayed on him for an appointment and that I pushed him to take the policy.

Upon contacting the wife of a recently deceased member, she told me that she knew her husband had a small policy with the Knights and that she was anxious to receive it because needed it to help pay for his funeral and some final medical bills. She was relieved and grateful because now that would completely cover her husband's final expenses and she would not have to dip into their savings.

We, as Knights of Columbus, were able to be of service to a long time, 4th degree Knight that also happened to be a WWII veteran. In his later years, his health deteriorated, and his wife would take him to the VA Hospital for his medical appointments. On one such visit, he tripped and fell backwards on a set of stairs. He hit his head on the cement and because of his fall, he went into a coma and died several days later.

He was an uninsured member of the Knights of Columbus, but he did have a long-standing life insurance plan with a reputable company, which he purchased before joining the Knights. When I met with his widow, I informed her of our Knights Accidental Death policy. I also offered to help her with any of her husband's final need arrangements. She said she would let me know if she needed anything.

Later, I called again to let her know I had a check from the Knights that I wanted to deliver to her. She was very impressed and remarked favorably of our personal and prompt service. She said that the Knights of Columbus were very considerate of all their members and she was grateful for our taking care of her. She had not received the death benefit from the other company yet and she felt their service was cold and impersonal. She did receive the death benefit later from the other company.
