The Easter Vigil is the "Mother of All Vigils. "Easter Sunday, then, is the greatest of all Sundays, and Easter Time is the most important of all liturgical times. Easter is the celebration of **the Lord's resurrection** from the dead, culminating in his Ascension to the Father and sending of the Holy Spirit upon the Church. There are **50 days** of Easter from the first Sunday to Pentecost. It is characterized, above all, by the joy of glorified life and the victory over death, expressed most fully in the great resounding cry of the Christian: Alleluia! All faith flows from faith in the resurrection: "If Christ has not been raised, then empty is our preaching; empty, too, is your faith." (1 Cor 15:14)



"What you sow is not brought to life unless it dies. And what you sow is not the body that is to be, but a bare kernel of wheat, perhaps, or of some other kind;... So also is the resurrection of the dead. It is sown corruptible; it is raised incorruptible. It is sown dishonorable; it is raised glorious. It is sown weak; it is raised powerful. It is sown a natural body; it is raised a spiritual body. If there is a natural body, there is also a spiritual one. So, too, it is written, "The first man, Adam, became a

living being," the last Adam a life-giving spirit. But the spiritual was not first; rather the natural and then the spiritual. The first man was from the earth, earthly; the second man, from heaven. As was the earthly one, so also are the earthly, and as is the heavenly one, so also are the heavenly. Just as we have borne the image of the earthly one, we shall also bear the image of the heavenly one (1 Cor 15:36-37, 42-49).

The octave of Easter comprises the eight days which stretch from the first to the second Sunday. It is a way of prolonging the joy of the initial day. In a sense, every day of the Octave is like a little Sunday.

The word "Easter" comes from Old English, meaning simply the "East." The sun which rises in the East, bringing light, warmth and hope, is a symbol for the Christian of the rising Christ, who is the true Light of the world. **The Paschal Candle** is a central symbol of this divine light, which is Christ. It is kept near the ambo throughout Easter Time and lit for all liturgical celebrations.

We thank you Lord for all your guidance and blessings, and we continue to place all we do as Knights firmly in Your hands.



ST. PATRICKS CELEBRATES 100 YEARS

Saint Patrick's Church, Calipatria, CA. Celebrating 100 Years of Proclaiming the Good News



The Knights of Columbus, Imperial Valley council 2130 and Imperial Valley Assembly 0064 helped celebrate St. Patrick's Church in Calipatria, CA, 100-year anniversary on Mar. 16, 2019. Father Mark Edney was the Celebrant, with Father Magana and Father Rey as Co-Celebrants. The Saint Patrick's Lady Society and the Guadalupanas were also in attendance. After the mass they had a dinner and dance in the church hall. Grand Knight took his mother of 92 years to celebrate the memories of St. Patrick's, as she was telling him different stories of all the priest that have served the small community.

St. Patrick's Church was established in 1919 and was part of the Diocese of Los Angeles, with Father O.F Boyers officiating the first baptism on March 23, 1919. There were 19 different priest that served as pastors during the next 23 years, due to the hot summers that would reach 120-degree temperature, as there was no air conditioning in those days.

St. Patrick's Church became part of the Diocese of San Diego in 1942 as Bishop Charles Buddy asked the Oblates of Mary Immaculate to serve the bilingual congregation, with Reverend J.A. Hamel O.M.I. serving as the first Oblate Priest in 1942 and Reverend Amador Lopez O.M.I serving as the last Oblate priest in 2009. Currently Reverend Reynaldo Roque is serving the community of over 650 families.



Grand Knight Art Barros from Imperial Valley Council 2130 grew up in the small community of Calipatria, and a member of St. Patrick's Church for 45 years, as he remembers helping his father and two brothers-built booths for the church fiestas. His Father and Brothers would cut palms for Palm Sunday for many years. His Mother and sisters would clean the church on Saturdays. He, his mom and 3 brothers and 4 sisters would walk to daily mass before heading to school every day, as they lived two blocks away from the church. He and his brothers were altar boys till after high school. The old church had a gas heater way up in the front, so in the winter time everyone would sit up front. Grand Knight remembers in the cold winter days, if he timed it

right and started walking to church, there was an elderly lady name Maria

Medina who drove from across town to church, and she would stop and give him a ride. He remembers ringing the old church bells before mass, as he would have to go outside and pull the rope hard, so the bells could be heard across town. On the weekends there was Carmen Borunda and Virginia Madrid that would take a group of kids, on the country roads to collect aluminum cans for the church building fund, that was built in 1975. The Grand Knight was baptized and made his first holy communion in the old church and made his confirmation in the new church. Pour closely over the pages below the "Programs" tab. You will find that the activities listed in our new Faith in Action program always begins with a section titled "A Higher Purpose." Let us put our Faith into action and always remember that we are following the example of Jesus. When we truly are exemplifying Charity to others through service, we are following the path of Jesus.

These Faith in Action activities can and should be your greatest recruiting tools. It is simple. Implement some of these new activities and be sure to focus on "A Higher Purpose." Always invite all parishioners (and others) to participate in your Faith in Action events. Those who come to one of these activities are showing by the action of taking time to participate that they are interested in the K of C. By joining in, they are already doing the work of a Knight of Columbus.

Make sure that you have a friendly Knight who is comfortable with recruiting ready to invite the men who are not Brothers to take the next step and join our Brotherhood. He should:

- 1. Be wearing some Knight's gear (a badge, a K of C hat or shirt, etc.)
- 2. Look for non-Knights who enjoyed the activity.
- 3. Ask the man (while smiling and nodding yes) these questions.
 - A. Did you like what we did?
 - B. Should we do it again?
 - C. Could you help us out a little next time?
 - D. Would you give me your contact info so we can invite you to help?
- 4. Give this man a Form 100 and guide him to complete some of the information.
- 5. Talk to him about what the Council does as he is filling out the form. Focus on Faith in Action activities that may fit his or his family's needs.
- 6. If he is positive and enthusiastic, ask him if he would like more information about the Knights of Columbus.
- 7. Be sure to invite him to the next Faith in Action activity your Council is hosting.
- 8. Thank him for participating and offer to pray with him and his family.

Father McGivney Guild

Brother Knights,

At the end of January, I received an update from Fr. Gabriel O'Donnell, OP, Vice-Postulator for the cause of Sainthood for our beloved founder, Venerable Fr. McGivney.

Fr. O'Donnell reported that the Roman process of investigation into his life and holiness is nearing completion and the investigation into a reported miracle is progressing. He goes on to say that the Guild plays an important role in making Father McGivney better known and spreading the word about his powerful intercession.

Many of our members are hesitant to join the Guild. Many think you are automatically a member if you are a Knight. Not so! Many apparently have never heard of the Guild. We simply have to do a better job of getting across to our members that our <u>prayers</u> are <u>important</u> and that joining this no -cost Guild is critical in showing our support.

As of January 2, 2019, there are 12,481 Guild members in our jurisdiction. I'm sure that includes family members and friends of Knights. I checked with my local Field Agent, Michael Wilson (#1 Agent in the State – attaboy!) and he tells me we have 76,564 Knights in California.

Our committee of Brother Knight Skip Frates and I, can't possibly reach everyone, but with <u>your</u> help we can make it happen.

At the next meeting of your Council, Chapter, or Assembly, please ask to have a few minutes' time during "The Good of the Order." Then ask those who do not belong to the Guild to raise their hand. Tell them we owe this to Fr. McGivney and the Church because of what the Order means to us. Ask them to take out their cell phone, punch in www.kofc.org and locate the McGivney Guild. They can put in their name and address and sign up right then and there!

Try this at your next work party or fund-raiser and you'll reach a different audience. Little effort – great results – <u>you</u> can make the difference.

Fr. O'Donnell reminds us that the spiritual heritage of Fr. McGivney is his precious gift to the K of C.

Talk to your District Deputies and Field Agent. Sometimes they can reach people that don't attend meetings. Remember, you don't have to be a Knight to join the Guild. Family members, friends, prayer group members may wish to join. There are also the advertisements in the "Columbia" if they want to use "snail mail."

Please accept this challenge - and I'd like your feedback.

ESSAY PROGRAMS

I would like, first of all, to Congratulate all the Councils & Chapters that participated in the 3 Essay programs for Columbian Year 2018-2019.

There was a 28% increase despite the delays in getting the Entry sheets to the Chapter & Councils.

The State Essay program has become the "Catholic Stewardship" Essay Competition for 4th thru 7th grades. This title will coincide with the Supreme Essay "Catholic Citizenship" essay program which is for 8th grade thru 12th Grade.

To update the data to the number of Essays received: "Keep Christ In Christmas" Essay, 17 Essays. Topic was: "How do we keep Jesus as the focus during the Christmas Season"

State Essay competition "Catholic Stewardship" for 4th thru 7th grades:

4th Grade - 5; 5th Grade - 7; 6th Grade - 6; 7th Grade - 23

Supreme Essay competition "Catholic Citizenship" Essay for 8th thru 12th grades:

8th Grade – 47; 9th Grade – 7; 10th Grade – 6; 11th Grade – 3; 12th Grade - 4

50% of the Chapters participated. Oakland Diocese Chapter #5 was the only Chapter to have 100% entries for all 3 Essay programs in all 14 groups. Los Padres Chapter #10 participated in 65% of the categories.

By the end of April there should be Winners certificates for KCIC Essay and the Catholic Stewardship Essay program on the State Website under forms. There will also be Participation certificates for the same programs. The Stewardship certificate will have the picture of St. Francis de Sales the patron Saint of writers. The certificates will be on display at the State Convention as well a copy of the winning Essays for all to read.

Steve Bolton: 'We Are the Edge of the Movement'

Volunteers within Special Olympics could easily be compared to the oil that flows through a machine, allowing everything to run smoothly. From setup, meal services and overall constant support, volunteers are the people that the athletes see most. Special Olympics could not be the success that it is without the work of its volunteers, especially ones like Steve Bolton.

Steve first volunteered at a Special Olympics event in 1983, where he was a hugger for athletes at the end of the track. He says it touched his heart, and ever since then, he has worked to continuously grow in his role as a volunteer. So much so that he is now a part of the Special Olympics Southern California Board of Directors.

"People ask me how I got so involved in Special Olympics, and I just say that it developed a life of its own," said Steve, who is the Special Olympics Orange County Regional Leadership Council Chair. "People think Special Olympics doesn't need the 'Joe's on the corner,' and I tell all my volunteers, 'What you're doing today is important. It's the little things you do that changes somebody's life or puts a smile on somebody's face."

With an attitude like his, it's not surprising that he not only inspires his volunteers, but his fellow peers as well.

"I consider him to be the consummate volunteer," said Kris Drummond, former SOSC VP of Development and Steve's friend. "He's willing to be a leader or a follower. He's happy doing whatever the situation or task requires."

Kris met Steve when she was the Special Olympics Orange County Regional Director, and he was on a committee for a charity golf tournament. After the event, he reached out wanting to discuss more ways to get involved, a quality that continues to characterize his work ethic today.

"I think Steve is a role model not only to volunteers, but to staff and families," Kris said. "In addition to his commitment, he has such a 'can-do' attitude and tireless dedication. He truly has a heart of gold."

It isn't just Steve's volunteer enthusiasm that's impressive. His determination to get others involved may be even more noteworthy. Steve was the lead in getting the Knights of Columbus, another organization that he volunteers his time with, to prepare meals for the athletes during Fall Games.

"He would not let go. He just kept pushing Special Olympics, Special Olympics, Special Olympics, and now he has much greater support throughout Southern California," Kris said about Steve's efforts to expand the number of Knights of Columbus volunteers that attend Special Olympics events. "He's truly a leader. He just doesn't give up and... I wish we could clone him."

In fact, the significance of the relationship between the Knights of Columbus and Special Olympics is something that Steve emphasizes when talking about the importance of their work today. Eunice's husband, Sergeant Shriver, was a member of the Knights of Columbus and one of the first volunteers of Special Olympics, so Steve finds it only fitting that they continue to support its cause today. "Ever since Eunice said to her friends, 'my sister has no place to go to associate with other people,' that little thought that one day, just looking out for her own sister, developed all of this."

The Knights of Columbus now prepare meals during many Regional Games as well as Fall Games, and their commitment to helping is relentless. During one of those events Kelly Johnson, Chairman of the SOSC Board of Directors, recalled his favorite moment of Steve, one that displayed just what kind of person he is.

"I remember seeing Steve volunteering at the Spring Games in Irvine a few years ago," Kelly said. "He had a boot on his foot so he was riding around in a cart helping transport food and supplies around the event. He could have stayed home, but he was there volunteering even though it was difficult for him to get around."

While it's easy for people to talk about all the things he does, Steve remembers a moment, years ago, that speaks to why he does it all. "This one kid was running, and he was dead last at the race. But at the very end, he's screaming to mom how happy he was. The mom's bawling, dad's bawling, the whole group is bawling. I'm thinking this is really such a neat deal not only for the athletes but for the families. She looks at me and says, 'He's never talked that much in his whole life.' It floored me that it affected her like that."


