We thank you Lord for all your guidance and blessings, and we continue to place all we do as Knights firmly in Your hands.



STATE DEPUTY'S MESSAGE


EVERY MEMBER A RECRUITER!

My Brothers,

My congratulations to all the newly elected officers for the 2019-2020 Columbian Year. I am honored to serve as your State Deputy. By mid-year we will have reached the beginning of another decade – 2020! To mark the beginning of another decade, we have set an ambitious membership goal of growing the Order in California to 80,000 members. We must recruit at least 6,000 new members; roughly

one new member per council per month. To accomplish this, it is important every member be engaged in recruitment. It is equally important to schedule frequent Admission Degrees and likewise take advantage of the new Online Membership as a means of introducing younger men to our Order. By offering membership to qualified Catholic men we renew the reasons most of us joined – charity, fraternal brotherhood, our common faith and the desire to "give back" to our church and community.

We also have many new programs to offer this fraternal year including the "Purita Warriner" Memorial Wheelchair Drive for veterans. Money contributed to this initiative will go towards providing wheelchairs to veterans including those participating in Honor Flights both in California and other jurisdictions. I know you will continue in all you do the great charitable giving for which California is noted, including the fund drive for people with intellectual disabilities, Special Olympics, Coats for Kids, Food for Families, Ultrasound Machines, RSVP Seminarians and many, many others. In addition to the traditional charitable programs there are many spiritual activities designed to further form our faith and engagement in our church. I hope you take advantage of the many activities offered and implement them in your council and parish.

California State K of C Ultrasound Program CY 2018-2019 Review

CY 2017-2018, our California Ultrasound Team posted a <u>Record 11 Ultrasounds</u> Approved & Placed with K of C Supreme Matching Funds.

This CY 2018-2019 we can report yet <u>another New Record with 13 Ultrasounds</u> being Delivered with K of C Supreme, etc. Matching Funds.

Our California Knights have supported the local funding and delivery of an accumulated <u>Grand Total of 76 Ultrasounds since 2009</u>.

In addition, there are three more completed ultrasound applications sent to Supreme which will result in those ultrasounds arriving in California during early CY 2019-2020.

Kudos to Many knights who were responsible for this accomplishment via:

Brother Knights worked together with increased communication between Councils, Supreme, and Pregnancy Centers.

Additional funding came from Individual Knights donations and new outside support.

Two individual knights personally donated \$10,000 each!
One Council donated \$40,000 to be used to support several locations!
The non-profit 4US.org donated 25% to several Ultrasounds being delivered!

Seminarian Support Program (RSVP) Appeal 2019-2020

Worthy outgoing Grand Knights, Worthy Incoming Grand Knights, soon you will be planning your 2019-2020 Council budget. I hope and pray that if your Council has not previously included in their annual budget a monetary support to our seminarians thru the Seminarian Support Program (RSVP), that this will be the year that your Council chooses to participate in this worthy program. If the seminarians in your Diocese have previously received the support of your Council, God Bless you!

We have over 500 seminarians in our great state, yet, we only reached out to 163 of them with some financial support this fraternal year. We can do better. We will do better!

I ask for each Council to invest in the future of our Church by supporting a seminarian. Send them a birthday card, a Christmas card or a just a well wishes card. Reach out to them with a text message on a regular basis. Commit your Council, Assembly and Chapter do donate \$500 this coming Columbian year to help defray the everyday living expenses of a seminarian. But most of all, pray for them at each meeting as a group and daily in your personal prayers.

Here are some action steps to follow in order to participate in the Seminarian Support Program (RSVP).

- 1. Locate a candidate to support. If you need help, contact your pastor or diocesan vocations director. You can contact me as well, since I have a list of most if not all the seminarians in the state.
- 2. After a candidate's name and address is secured, prepare and send a letter of introduction from your Council, Assembly or Chapter.
- 3. Define how money is to be raised.
- 4. Define how the relationship will be managed.
- 5. All funds should be sent directly to the seminarian, unless expressly requested differently by the vocation's director of your Diocese. A word of caution, unless the check is made out to the seminarian, you will not receive a refund from Supreme.
- 6. When presenting money to an RSVP candidate, notify me so I may keep an accurate accounting of those seminarians that are receiving support as well as of those that are not. I would also provide this information to each Diocese upon request.
- 7. RSVP assistance also involves prayer and moral support. Send them letters i.e.: birthday, Christmas, Easter, and welcome back to school greetings each fraternal year.
- 8. Encourage members and their families to keep seminarian or postulant in their prayers.
- 9. Invite seminarian or postulant to all council activities and include in mailing of newsletter or other communications.
- 10. Invite seminarians or postulants to make a presentation to the council, parish, and/or parish youth groups on what it means to prepare for priesthood or religious life.
- 11. Make sure to offer congratulations and support to your seminarian or postulant on their ordination.
- 12. Apply for a refund from Supreme Council office to be eligible for refund, monies must be given directly to an individual (not a an institution of fund)); money given to an individual must be vocations related and donated between July 1st June 30th of the respective fraternal year; paid with a check drawn from the Council, Assembly or Chapter account; and copies of check or other documentation must accompany application for refund. Refer to the RSVP Refund Application (#2863, attached) for exact details and procedures for filing for this refund. Please send me a copy as well!

Please remember that without new seminarians, we will have no priests. Without priests, we will have no eucharist. Without eucharist, we will have no Church.

THE COUNCIL YEARBOOK PROGRAM IS BACK

Three Awards (1st, 2nd & 3rd) will be given to the council that creates the most informative council year book which documents the council's many fraternal activities throughout the Columbian year. The activities should reflect the four principles of our order. Yearbook competition is on a statewide basis and not on a division basis. You are competing with every council in the State of California for these awards.

Judging will take place at the annual state convention in May.

Council Yearbook Guidelines

The following guidelines have been established as basis for the council yearbook awards.

- There will be no points for fancy covers.
- Each yearbook will be judged entirely on its contents alone.
- <u>Dedication Page</u> State the reason you are dedicating the yearbook, provide a picture as appropriate, if applicable to the dedication. To whom or to what you dedicating your yearbook is your decision.
- <u>History Page</u> Write a brief history of your council containing the pictures if possible and past accomplishments of your council. Length is not a key factor, but it must be informative.
- Required Pictures Individual and or group pictures of all council officers elected or appointed, to include the council chaplain or spiritual director if any, properly labeled with the title of office and name of council officers. Another set of individual and or group pictures of all program directors properly labeled with title and name of directors on the following page. Additional pictures are required and identified as to the activity. Where it is possible, identify all the people in the picture. Activities a picture of the activity director to appear on the first page of each activity stating the name of the activity. A separate page of each activity with a description is desirable. A maximum of six pictures per activity. The size of the activity does not matter, but it must be a council activity performed during this Columbian Year.

To be considered for judging, your council yearbook must be in the designated room prior to 11:00AM Friday at the State Convention. Late entries will not be entertained. Grading of yearbooks will commence at 11:30 AM.

Star Council Outreach Program

By now you should have submitted your Form 365 – Service Program Personnel Report (This is an important form, so Supreme knows who to provide the chairman with important information about their programs. You should also be working on your council semi-annual audit which is due to Supreme by August 15.

I know you will be getting reminders from various levels of the knights' bureaucracy, but once I get a list of which councils have submitted the required forms, I will tailor my emails and phone calls to those council that need a reminder.

The normal procedure is if a form is not submitted on time,

- the State Deputy gets a call
- he then calls the assigned District Deputy, who in turn calls the Grand Knight
- if the District Deputy has a copy of the required form, he can send it to Supreme, eliminating a call to the Grand Knight. (That is why it is always good to keep the District Deputy in the loop.)

By the way the Report of Officers Chosen Form 185 was due to Supreme by June 30.
