

Passing of Virgil C. Dechant — Supreme Knight, From 1977 to 2000

The Knights of Columbus mourns the loss of Past Supreme Knight Virgil C. Dechant, who passed away in his sleep at the age of 89 during the early morning hours of February 16, 2020. He was the Order's longest-serving supreme knight, holding the office from 1977 to 2000.

"God has called home a good man and one of the Knights' great leaders," said Supreme Knight Carl Anderson. "Virgil Dechant used to say that his goal was to leave the Knights better than he found it, and in myriad ways, he accomplished that. He leaves a lasting legacy and an excellent example of what it means to be a Knight and a fraternalist. Nowhere is this more true than in his home state of Kansas, which remains in many ways a model jurisdiction."

Virgil Dechant joined the Knights in 1949 and was a member of LaCrosse (Kansas) Council 2970 and St. Augustine Council 2340 in Liebanthal, Kansas. A very successful businessman, in addition to operating a private farm in Kansas, Dechant owned and operated his own car dealership and farm equipment firm. Dechant came to New Haven in 1967 to serve as the supreme secretary. Ten years later, he was elected supreme knight.

As supreme knight, Virgil Dechant oversaw tremendous growth in the Order's membership as well as in its assets and insurance business, while also opening the Order to greater involvement by the wives and families of its members. In addition, Mr. Dechant forged a close relationship with the Vatican during the pontificate of St. John Paul II, leading the Order to sponsor numerous renovation projects – including of the façade of St. Peter's Basilica, and working with the pope to promote the faith in Eastern Europe, which was then behind the iron curtain.

Dechant is survived by his wife, Ann, their four children and several grandchildren and great-grandchildren.

How to Lower Your Blood Pressure Without Meds

High blood pressure is surprisingly common, <u>affecting</u> (1) 46% of American adults – that's over 100 million people.

And it's a serious threat. High blood pressure increases the risk for heart attack, heart failure, stroke, kidney failure, and several other life-threatening health problems. In fact, high blood pressure causes about 1,000 deaths in the U.S. PER DAY (2). Even more disturbing is that most of these deaths are preventable. High blood pressure is almost always treatable with lifestyle changes and inexpensive medication, yet less than half of people with high blood pressure have it under control.

Lifestyle and High Blood Pressure

Experts suggest that 50% - 90% of high blood pressure could be successfully lowered with lifestyle change.

In my practice, if a patient's blood pressure is mildly elevated and there are no high risk factors (such as diabetes, current smoker or history of heart disease, stroke or multiple cardiac risk factors), I will recommend a 3-month trial of lifestyle change as an initial treatment. I let my patients know that many of these changes can be as effective as any single blood pressure medication.

For many of my patients, the potential to avoid being on medication for the rest of their lives is a strong motivator, and they appreciate the sense of control they have over their health.

Here are the specific areas I recommend my patients focus on in order to lower their blood pressure:

- Physical Activity: Even a modest level of physical activity, over time, can make a
 significant difference in your blood pressure. If you're not used to exercise, start slow.
 Five or 10 minutes a day of your favorite activity can be just the start you need to build an
 exercise habit and allow you to build up to the 2 hours and 30 minutes a week of activity
 recommended by national guidelines.
- Healthy Diet: I recommend cutting out highly processed food (packaged foods typically high in added sugar and/or refined grains). Watching your salt intake is important if you have high blood pressure, but keep in mind that most of the salt in our diets comes from processed foods and restaurants.
- Weight Loss: Losing even 5% of your starting body weight has been proven to significantly lower blood pressure; and 10% has been shown to dramatically improve other health conditions such as atrial fibrillation. The weight loss strategy I recommend to my patients is the one that works in the long run. Use the lasting power of creating better habits. Restrictive diets might work in the short run, but their results rarely last.
- Limited alcohol intake (less than one drink per day): A recent study (3) showed that people who drank 7 13 drinks per week were 53% more likely to have stage I hypertension. Those who drank more than 14 drinks per week had a 69% higher risk of hypertension.
- Not smoking: Smoking cessation can modestly lower blood pressure and dramatically lower the risk for future heart disease.

In addition to these lifestyle changes, avoid regular use of anti-inflammatory medications, like ibuprofen and naproxen, and treat sleep apnea if you have it.

One of the more gratifying events in my practice is when a patient is able to lower, or even eliminate, blood pressure medications because of healthier lifestyle choices. If you have high blood pressure, don't miss out on this powerful therapy.

Into the Breech - A Call to Battle



Special Olympics — Reporting Activities

Brother Knights,

Thank you for your leadership in promoting Special Olympics in your Council. Special Olympics Reporting Form 4584 was due on January 31st but it is not too late to submit it. If you have not already done so and your Council has participated in any of the below you will need to fill out and submit the Supreme Special Olympics Form 4584:

- 1. Council members have volunteered at a Special Olympics event between January 1, 2019 and December 31, 2019;
- 2. Council has donated to Special Olympics either directly or through the Columbian Foundation;
- 3. Council has donated to support a Special Olympics event through your Chapter; or
- 4. Council has donated to the Feed The Athlete Fund through the Columbian Foundation.

Councils must submit completed forms to fraternalmission@kofc.org by Monday, March 9, 2020 for the State Council to be considered in this year's jurisdictional rankings. After March 9th, rankings will be determined. Checks will later be issued by the Supreme Council and sent to your State Deputy for presentation to his state/provincial Special Olympics organization at the State Convention. Your reporting does make difference. I have attached the Form 4584.

If you have not donated to the State's Feed the Athlete program this Columbian year I would encourage you to do so. We are asking each Council to donate \$300 through the Columbian Foundation using the State's standalone Feed the Athlete form which is attached. The State Council will make a Feed the Athlete donation to Special Olympics at the State Convention from this fund as well. Through your efforts the Feed the Athlete program raises specially earmarked funds so the Knights of Columbus can be the major sponsor of meals for athletes at Special Olympics events throughout the state. Raising funds to sponsor the meals at these events helps our local councils provide lunches to the athletes and provides volunteer opportunities. Last year we had 18 State Council approved Feed the Athlete events and this year we are on our way to have even more.

Last but not least, I encourage you to apply for an award at the State Convention if you have participated in Special Olympics. I have attached the State Award form. The award form should be submitted to the Life Activities Director Richard Marciniak, marciniakr@aol.com, 5496 Katherine Ave., Sherman Oaks CA 91401-4921. The award form is due to the activities director by April 1.





Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent, a time to reflect on your relationship with our Lord and Savior. Ash Wednesday comes from the ancient Jewish tradition of penance and fasting. The practice includes the wearing of ashes on the head. The ashes symbolize the dust from which God made us. As the priest applies the ashes to a person's forehead, he speaks the words: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

Alternatively, the priest may speak the words, "Repent and believe in the Gospel." Ashes also symbolize grief, in this case, grief that we have sinned and caused division from God. Writings from the Second-century Church refer to the wearing of ashes as a sign of penance.

Priests administer ashes during Mass, and all are invited to accept the ashes as a visible symbol of penance. Even non-Christians and the excommunicated are welcome to receive the ashes. The ashes are made from blessed palm branches, taken from the previous year's Palm Sunday Mass.

Seminarians can Repurpose "OLD" Fourth Degree Regalia Capes

With any change in life, it is sometimes hard to know what the way ahead looks like. Change is inevitable we are told, and we inevitably are uncomfortable with it. With the change brought to the 4th Degree color guard in 2019, there was question as to what should be done with the venerable old uniforms upon their retirement. I myself am a convert to the Catholic Church. Yet even in my years as a non-Catholic, I always recognized the Knights of Columbus in their rather romanticized feathery hats and brightly colored capes.

When I read about the change in standards for the 4th Degree, I wondered "what would become of those capes that had served God, Church and Country so faithfully for so many years?" I reasoned that many would keep their retired regalia so that they could have the honor of being buried in it when that time came. Others would buy the new uniform and move on. Still others would desire to continue to wear their time-honored uniform; but with the directives from Supreme this last desire would not and could not be realized. I continued to ponder however, what would become of those capes which would be no longer needed. I prayed and wondered what new life could be given to these articles that had served so faithfully for so long.

In holy hour one day, I realized that when priests and seminarians wear cassocks out of doors, either in liturgical settings or in non-liturgical settings, the weather sometimes requires something more then just the cassock. In general, modern overcoats do not go well with the cassock; and being that priests and seminarians are not generally men of means, an appropriate cape or cloak can be hard to come by. It was with this thought that I realized that with a few minor modifications, the old Knights of Columbus 4th degree capes could be given a new lease on life and benefit both priests and seminarians alike.

The modifications are rather simple. I would begin by removing the KofC patches from the collar, I would then proceed to remove the colored inner lining of the cape. After this the cape is ready for its new life as an outer cover from the elements for priests and seminarians. I decided after some council with fellow seminarians to leave the gold or silver

chain that closes around the neck. This is in some way an homage to the garment's former life as a cape of the 4th degree. Generally, these chain closures have some sort of religious insignia on them which is most appropriate for a priest or seminarian to wear.

This endeavor to reuse the capes is also in the spirit of our Holy Father Pope Francis' Encyclical *Laudato Si*. The Holy Father speaks of a throw away culture where things are acquired by many only to have them thrown away when either their intended use has passed, or their novelty wears off. To be good stewards of what The Lord has given to us, we must seek to cherish that which has been given to us through God's ever abundant means.

So, it is with this initiative! Rather than storing the capes never to be used again, giving them to a secondhand shop, or even throwing them into an incinerator (all of these and more were ideas and means of "getting rid of the capes"); the capes will now serve a new purpose! It will be there when a priest is comforting a family at the grave side of a loved one, it will be there when a priest is praying his rosary in front of an abortion clinic, it will keep a priest warm as he is walking in his parish visiting his parishioners, and it will be there when father makes his daily walk to and from the rectory to the church to offer the sacrifice of the Holy Mass for you and for me.

I am honored now to be a 4th degree member of the Knights of Columbus. My own Assembly (JJ Mitty Assembly #0078) has supported me in this endeavor and sent me capes that were no longer needed or wanted. Still other Knights in California have sent me capes in the mail with good wishes and prayers for their future use. It is the way of the Knights of Columbus to be good stewards as well as to support both priests and seminarians as they always have done. Through this initiative of repurposing the 4th degree capes, both of these ideals; stewardship and support, will be realized for years to come.
