

Knights of Columbus Elects Next Supreme Knight

The Knights of Columbus Board of Directors elected Patrick E. Kelly as the next Supreme Knight on Feb. 5, to continue the mission of charity, unity and fraternity established by the Order's Founder, Blessed Michael McGivney, almost 140 years ago.

Carl A. Anderson will retire February 28, after more than 20 years of service as Supreme Knight and upon reaching the mandatory retirement age of 70. He leaves a legacy of Christian witness and service to the Catholic Church, to the Knights of Columbus and to communities throughout the world.

Patrick Kelly's tenure as the Order's 14th Supreme Knight will commence March 1.

Statement by retiring Supreme Knight Carl Anderson:

He has served as Deputy Supreme Knight for four years and is a well-rounded public servant with diplomatic and military experience. He is ideally suited to carry on the work of the Knights of Columbus as we enter a new era, faithful to our principles of charity, unity and fraternity, and in close collaboration with the Holy See and the bishops throughout the world. As Deputy Supreme Knight, Patrick has played a leading role in several major initiatives, including our international religious freedom efforts, our pro-life Ultrasound Initiative, and our new public initiation ceremony. He also served as Executive Director of the Saint John Paul II National Shrine, leading its transformation through the creation of its worship spaces and world-class exhibit on the life of St. John Paul II. Most recently, Patrick led the Knights' grassroots response to the COVID-19 pandemic titled "Leave No Neighbor Behind." Through this initiative, brother Knights around the world are serving those isolated and alone in quarantine, supporting food banks and blood centers in need of vital supplies, and providing other essential services. Patrick has the experience and strong faith necessary to lead the Knights into the future."

For over a decade, Patrick Kelly has worked at a senior level on the frontlines of the Knights' work in charity, advocacy, and the management of the organization's multibillion-dollar insurance and investment operations. Mr. Kelly joined the Knights as a student at Marquette University in 1983 and later served as State Deputy in the District of Columbia from 2012-2013. He was named the Knights' Vice President for Public Policy in 2006 and was elected Deputy Supreme Knight in January 2017.

The newly elected Supreme Knight is a retired Navy Captain with 24 years of military service. In 2016, he retired from the U.S. Navy Judge Advocate General's (JAG) Corps Reserve, where he specialized in international and operational law and served as the Commanding Officer of the international law unit at the United States Naval War College. Previously, Mr. Kelly had a long career of public service that included advisory roles to Congress and the Department of Justice. Mr. Kelly also served as Senior Advisor to the Ambassador-at-Large for International Religious Freedom at the State Department. His responsibilities included serving as the Department's principal interlocutor with the Holy See and other nations on religious freedom issues.

Mr. Kelly holds a law degree from Marquette University Law School and a master's in theology from the Pontifical John Paul II Institute for Studies on Marriage and Family at The Catholic University of America.

Faith Formation Companion to Prayers in the Pew™

→ MONTHLY SYNOPSIS ←

February 2021 – February is a month of contrasts. We barely finish the Christmas season when we are thrown into the penitential season of Lent. It is a good time to remember and help those around us who are suffering. It is also an important time to pray for the peace of mind and heart that can only come from the Spirit of Christ.

PRAYER FOR THE SICK

It is a little-known fact that the Catholic Church is largely responsible for what today we call *hospitals*. The Latin word hospes means "guest" or "traveler", and it was the work of the Church – from the very beginning – to provide hospitality and charity to those who were in need of it.

What was the motivation for Christians to provide healthcare to others? Simply, the words of Jesus: "For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me" (Matthew 25:35-36).

Based on these convictions, the record shows that Christians organized care of the sick throughout every age of history since the time of Jesus, particularly in times of great need such as when plagues (read: *pandemics*) wrought havoc on their populations.

Many great saints like St. Basil, Sr. Jerome, and St. Cyprian established hospitals in their areas for care of the sick and suffering. The Council of Nicea (325 AD) even ordered that every city which had a cathedral should also have a hospital.

Over time, lay and religious orders formed in the Church that were dedicated exclusively to the care of the sick (such as the Knights Hospitallers, the Alexians. some branches of the Benedictines, Franciscans, Carmelites, the Missionaries of Charity, and others.)

The average Christian who is not a healthcare professional may not be able to care directly for the sick and suffering, but we can all pray for those who are ill as one of the Christian works of mercy. The Church gives us a simple Prayer for the Sick in the following words that we may pray any time we are concerned about the health and wellbeing of another:

Father in heaven, grant **N**. comfort in his/her suffering. Give him (her) courage when afraid, patience when afflicted, hope when dejected, and when alone, assure him (her) of the prayerful support of your holy people. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Since sickness is part of a fallen world and will always be with us, we often need to ask for peace of heart to deal with it. Many times illness is stronger than we are.

In times of sickness, problems, or upheaval, we should recall St. Paul's consoling words to the Philippians to ask for peace and to remind us that nothing is stronger than Christ's love for us: "Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God. Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 4:6-7).



SPIRITUAL CHALLENGE

As we head into the Lenten Season, I challenge you to identify those in your immediate circle who suffer in any way. Reach out to them if possible, even if it is just a word of support and sympathy. Most importantly, include them in your prayers and the prayers of your family so that they may receive the spiritual consolation the Church provides.

BIBLE BASICS -

FAITH FUNDAMENTALS -

The Corporal Works of Mercy

The term "corporal" signifies bodily needs, and these works of mercy are anything that helps people overcome their material sufferings of this world. The Church's description of the Corporal Works of Mercy comes directly from the famous passage of the Sheep and Goats in Matthew 25, where Jesus claims that "whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me" (Matthew 25:40). The parable includes six actions and the Church adds a seventh – to bury the dead – since it was a paramount religious observance of the Jews. Here is the Church's list of the seven Corporal Works of Mercy:

- 1. To feed the hungry
- 5. To shelter the homeless
- 2. To give drink to the thirsty
- 6. To visit the sick
- To clothe the naked
- 7. To bury the dead
- 4. To visit the imprisoned

We can never practice these good works too often.

FEATURED PROGRAM

MASS FOR PEOPLE WITH SPECIAL NEEDS

Knights of Columbus councils often sponsor Masses for People with Special Needs in the local community. This would include people with intellectual and developmental disabilities and must be organized in conjunction with the local Pastor, as well as designated members of parish staff.

The Masses can be an invaluable opportunity to welcome families of special needs children and adults who might not normally feel comfortable coming to a regularly scheduled Mass. Such an experience also assists a parish in welcoming these families to become more comfortable and involved in participating in regular Masses. Even if the local parish does not have a designated Mass for People with Special Needs, Lent is undoubtedly a time to open our hearts and minds to those who are less fortunate than we are and to advocate for their welfare in any way we can.

CATECHISM CONNECTION



2447 The works of mercy are charitable actions by which we come to the aid of our neighbor in his spiritual and bodily necessities. Instructing, advising, consoling, comforting are spiritual works of mercy, as

are forgiving and bearing wrongs patiently.

The corporal works of mercy consist especially in feeding the hungry, sheltering the homeless, clothing the naked, visiting the sick and imprisoned, and burying the dead. Among all these, giving alms to the poor is one of the chief witnesses to fraternal charity: it is also a work of justice pleasing to God.

CARL ANDERSON joined the leadership of the Knights of Columbus after a distinguished career as a public servant and educator. He served as vice president for public policy and supreme secretary before taking office as the 13th supreme knight in October 2000. Under his leadership, the Order surpassed 2 million members and \$100 billion of life insurance in force, and expanded internationally for the first time in a century. His signature initiatives have included the Saint John Paul II National Shrine, the Ultrasound Initiative, Building the Domestic Church, and a landmark campaign in support of persecuted Christians. Reaching the mandatory retirement age of 70 for Supreme Officers, he will retire at the end of February 2021.

Re: Resolutions Presented at State and Supreme Council Meetings

The Laws of the Knights of Columbus permit State Councils to submit to the Supreme Council resolutions that pertain to issues affecting the entire Order. It is expected that all such resolutions will be submitted in good faith and in a spirit of charity, unity, and fraternity. As you prepare for your conventions, please bear in mind the principles and procedures set forth below.

The Supreme Council established the resolutions process to enable subordinate councils to:

- (1) Express gratitude or support for a person, a fraternal program, or a policy of the Order;
- (2) Amend the Constitution or Laws of the Order;
- (3) Express an official position of the Knights of Columbus on matters relevant to the mission and identity of the Order; and
- (4) Offer proposals to enhance the Order's fraternal mission.

State Councils should not submit resolutions that: (1) concern monetary expenditures by the Supreme Council, such as financial grants to organizations; (2) deal exclusively with matters of local significance that are relevant only to that particular jurisdiction; (3) endorse, recognize, commend, denounce, or criticize individual persons or other organizations; (4) propose changes to

administrative policies, functions, or procedures of Home Office Departments; or (5) have been rejected by delegates to the Supreme Council in recent years.

Resolutions that do not conform to these expectations and purposes may be deemed out of order, in which case they would not be published to the Supreme Council and would not be considered by the delegates.

Under the Order's procedures, delegates to the Supreme Council may consider only those resolutions that have been officially adopted by a State Council or submitted to the Supreme Council by the Board of Directors. Resolutions that have not been adopted by the State Council should not be submitted to the Supreme Council. A State Council must affirmatively adopt a resolution for the Supreme Council to consider it. "Adoption" of a resolution by a State Council means that the program, policy, or sentiment expressed in the resolution has the support of a majority of the delegates to the State Council meeting. By adopting a resolution and submitting it to the Supreme Council, the State Council is effectively stating that it supports the resolution and recommends adoption by the Supreme Council.

A State Council may also use the resolutions process to amend its own by-laws. Upon adoption of a resolution proposing any changes to its by-laws, the State Council shall submit the proposed amendments to the Supreme Secretary, who will forward them to the Supreme Advocate for review and recommendation by a committee of the Board of Directors. The committee will then present the proposed amendments to the full Board of Directors. The Board will consider and vote upon these amendments at its meeting in August.

Pursuant to Section 22 of the Laws of the Knights of Columbus, resolutions adopted by a State Council for consideration by the Supreme Council or the Board of Directors, including proposed amendments to State Council by-laws, must be submitted to the **Office of the Supreme Secretary** no later than June 15. Please submit these resolutions by email using the following email address: supremesecretary@kofc.org

Resolutions received by the Supreme Secretary will be acknowledged in writing and sent to the Office of the Supreme Advocate for purposes of inventory and preliminary review. Once the resolutions are categorized, organized, and

published in a booklet, they will be referred to the Committee on Laws and Resolutions. Any resolutions received after June 15 will not be published to the Supreme Convention and will not be considered by the delegates.

2020-2021 Council Level Free Throw Competition

The Knights of Columbus Free Throw competition provides a fun athletic outlet for young people ages 9 to 14 and encourages the values of sportsmanship and healthy competition. Because of Covid-19 restrictions, the State Council has made adjustments as to how the free throw competition will be run this year. Please see the instructions below.

Instructions for Remote Council Level Free-Throw Competition

- 1. Parents and legal custodians are encouraged to locate a basketball court to record their child's free throw competition attempts in safe manner, socially distanced from others. The competitions will be done solo this year, not in a group setting and will be recorded.
- 2. The basketball hoop used for the free throws can be in a park, schoolyard or it can be a driveway with a basketball hoop.
- 3. Please get as close to the ball size, hoop height and distance specifications as possible. We want the children to participate! Get as close as you can to be uniform and fair but we encourage all children to participate.
- 4. Participants are encouraged to practice beforehand, but to ensure fairness, parents/custodians should video record and submit only ONE official attempt.
- 5. The parent will fill out the scorecard after videoing, attest to the accuracy of the score by signature and submit by email the filled out, verified score card and video file to the council free-throw chairman.
- 6. Please name the video file with the following format, **council** # **dot child's last name dot child's first name**. (Example): 12345.Smith.Tommy.
- 7. Ages 9, 10, 11 (Boys & girls competitions) are recommended to use a women's regulation-size basketball and shoot from a 12-foot foul line at a 10-foot-high basket.(note: the normal foul line is 15 feet from the basket).
- 8. Ages 12, 13, 14 (girls competitions) are recommended to use a women's regulation-size basketball and shoot from the regulation foul line 15 feet from a 10-foot-high basket.
- 9. Ages 12, 13, 14 (Boys competitions) are recommended to use a men's regulation-size basketball and shoot from the regulation foul line 15 feet from a 10-foot-high basket.
- 10. After practice, each contestant receives 15 consecutive free throw attempts from the appropriate age-designated foul line. The attending parent/custodian videos the attempts. The parent/custodian marks an X on the scorecard on attempts where baskets were made and a 0 on baskets missed and then writes the total baskets made in the proper column on the score card. The parent/custodian then signs the card. The parent/custodian scans the scorecard and emails it to Council chairman along with the properly named video file. USE ENTRY FORM / SCORESHEET FORM #1598

They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. (Gospel for Jan. 3, Mt 2:10-11)

It's quite a magnificent scene: Intellectuals from a faraway land, not even of the Jewish faith, travel to pay homage to the newborn king. Their gifts acknowledge the child's kingship and foreshadow the sacrifice he was to make. They are also a sign of what a gift this newborn king is to the entire world. We must also recognize every child as a gift to the world, created in the image of God himself. May we recommit ourselves with renewed vigor to protect and cherish the life and dignity of every human person.

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

I challenge you to take a concrete, tangible action to support the cause for life in your community, by donating money or supplies to a pregnancy resource center, praying outside an abortion facility or joining your parish's pro-life group. Second, I challenge you to participate with your brother Knights in the Faith in Action Novena for Life program or, if possible, the March for Life program.

Questions for Reflection:

Do you see the image of God in every child, in every person, or do you sometimes look at others as objects to be used? What does taking action to defend life show you about how individuals can impact the world? What more can you do to support the cause for life, whether the contribution is great or small or consists of prayer or works?
