CAMPESINOS STATE PROGRAM

Campesinos Program Chairman SK George Arias sent out this message:

Due to a recent failure of a major employer of campesinos in both orchards and packing houses in the area (Prima Wawona), the campesinos and their families will be impacted as they were laid off last month. That company employs **~5,000 permanent and mostly seasonal workers** (this does not account for their families) in 5 packing houses and 15,000 acres of land, mostly in the area between Fresno and Visalia.

The sister communities of Cutler-Orosi (located ~15 miles north of Visalia) are locations for both packing houses and orchards for the failed Prima Wawona company. These would therefore be a great target for this distribution.

Brothers, on behalf of our Campesinos and their families, in this area, we MUST ask our Brother Knights to reach out to their councils for help, during these overwhelming times in the area. It is crucial to demonstrate to them and the community, we are MEN OF ACTION. We cannot in good conscience come to our State Convention in May and not want to help with so much misfortune in the area.

Please bring this up at your meeting in April or early May and encourage your council to bring a donation to the state convention.

SUPREME ASAP PROGRAM

State “Pass the Hat” Message from Supreme:

Every state council is encouraged to “pass the hat,” especially during their state conventions, to raise money for pregnancy resource centers and maternity homes as part of the Order’s ASAP program. To reward those who do this most effectively, the jurisdiction in each membership division (1-6) that raises the most money by May 31 will receive a check for \$1500. Funds donated to PRCs and MHs will also be matched 25% with a cap of \$10,000 per jurisdiction. Annual Campaign for People With Intellectual Disabilities

To date California councils have raised over \$363,600 for people with intellectual disabilities, and the total is still growing. Please continue to encourage councils in your chapter and district to hold a fundraiser or make a charitable contribution benefiting people with intellectual disabilities. Strive for 100% district and chapter participation!

Councils achieving \$4,000 or more in cumulative contributions from July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024 will receive the "Benefactor's Award" at bronze, silver and gold levels depending upon the amount raised. District Deputies achieving 100% district participation will also be recognized, along with chapters having the highest earnings and percentage of participation. All contributions count as a *Faith In Action* activity in the "Life" section of the Form SP-7 Columbian Award Application.
