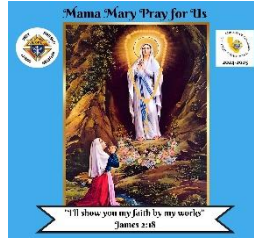

Evangelization and Faith Formation/Live COR Exercise

DIRECTIONS: In your group of 8-10 men, please appoint a facilitator/leader for the COR session amongst you. The parable below will be read 3 times – first, by the facilitator at normal pace, followed by a second time and a third time by a different person within the group at slow pace. After the third time, the facilitator will ask the group what word or words stood out that captured their attention (everyone in the group will participate). Following this exercise, each member of the group will answer the two reflection questions below. They will not write their answers, but share them aloud within their group.

When a large crowd gathered, with people from one town after another journeying to him, he spoke in a parable.

“A sower went out to sow his seed. And as he sowed, some seed fell on the path and was trampled, and the birds of the sky ate it up. Some seed fell on rocky ground, and when it grew, it withered for lack of moisture. Some seed fell among thorns, and the thorns grew with it and choked it. And some seed fell on good soil, and when it grew, it produced fruit a hundredfold.” After saying this, he called out, “Whoever has ears to hear ought to hear.” (Luke 8:4-8)

1. How does the parable of the sower from the Gospel of Luke apply to how we are called to bring others closer to Christ? How do we plant the seeds of faith in them?
2. How will each one of us show our faith by our works this year? What can we do to spread the good news, starting with our families?
